

OUR MASTERS

The first SEBA Masters Invitational Championships were held at the Cliftonville Bowl during the run of the Area Championships and very successful they turned out to be. The brainchild of Area Executive Vice President TOM BALLINGALL the event is not open to all SEBA Members as one would expect but is designed to put on show once a year all the bowlers closed by both Essex and Kent to represent them in the Inter-County Championships and any other county events. Trophies are awarded to both male and female champions with another cup going to the county that amasses the highest total pinfall over all games bowled. With neither event being decided until the final frames of the last game the large number of spectators witnessed five hours of very exciting bowling with the trophies eventually going to VI MORRISON for Kent and PAUL SCOTTOW for Essex. The county trophy for the first year went to Kent by 25,271 pins to 24,417 with the Kent men, after an 'up and downer' winning by just 86 pins and the Kent ladies finishing ahead by 768. For the Kent men the task is much more difficult as the London team is packed with internationals and Sussex are also quite a formidable side. The selectors have got their work cut out here to try and produce a Kent man's team to make the finals for the first time. The position in the Kent ladies section is quite intriguing as whilst Kent are a strong side so are both London and Surrey. A battle royal is envisaged in the next three rounds but for us Kent are still the favourites despite having a little leeway to make up. The next rounds are on June 25th.

The ABC Bowl at Leytonstone closed its doors on May 20th to make way for a redevelopment scheme. Lewisham and Harlow are taking one league each and Dagenham are to house three. The INTERNATIONAL rolls at Harlow and the EMPIRE, POLARIS and SUNDAY MORNING fit into Dagenham after an amount of time shunting. These four leagues are welcomed into S.E.B.A. and we look forward to publishing news from them in this publication once they settle down in their new surroundings. The closure of Leytonstone was, in many ways, ironical as the centre seemed to be doing better business than at any time for the past few years. It would seem that any bowl situated on valuable re-development land is very vulnerable to re-development whether or not the centre is making a good return for its owner. The safe centres would seem to be those situated above shops and the like or in places where their land is of no interest to those who buy land at today's inflated prices.

Having deviated somewhat from league news it is time to mention three new 700 series rolled since our last issue. DENNIS LOTT joins the elite as detailed above and RAY HOOK, in tremendous form since joining the Wembley All Stars, adds a 719 to his 717 and 700 already listed. Ray's biggest yet came in the Supreme League where two new teams come in for the Summer Schedule. The new boys are a local side, the KINGFISHERS, who have already distinguished themselves in a number of tournaments and an amalgam of the Cliftonville All Stars, Orphaians and Ski-Bolts who are calling themselves the FOUNDATION and are travelling in every Thursday to Dagenham from Cliftonville, Whitstable and Chatham. TED CULLEN is skipper and chauffeur and got to Dagenham from Whitstable the other week in precisely 38 minutes - 120 m.p.h. down the motorway??

The periods third 700 came from MIKE LUCKHURST who bowled his first and Cliftonville's only such series a few years back. He has now repeated the dose and given the bowl a new record 711 to beat. Mike's games were 235-211-265.

Young Dagenham bowler KEITH FLACK came into the centre on Saturday morning for practise. He proceeded to roll a creditable 178 game as a loosener and then went mad! Stringing alternate strikes and spares for 22 frames he recorded back to back Dutch 200 games and then as if this phenomenon wasn't enough then strung 11 strikes in a row and an 8 to record a 298 game! European Youth

Youth teams from FINLAND, SWEDEN, DENMARK, BELGIUM, WEST GERMANY and HOLLAND in addition to GREAT BRITAIN all competed at the Ambassador Lanes, Hounslow for four days to decide the first ever F.I.Q. EUROPEAN YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS. Bowling doubles, trios, fives and a final all events the event went very well indeed and was the forerunner of many such championships to come in the years ahead. The home country was placed fourth in the opening doubles with PAUL CARPENTER and NIGEL THOMPSON hitting 2264 to the winners 2424. The first golds went to SWEDEN with P. KARLSSON hitting 589 and 608 and V. WALLQVIST 552 and a mighty 675. Britain's warm up complete they then proceeded to take the gold medals in the trios event with the score card looking as follows:-

Sweden were second and third with 3436 and 3431 with West Germany fourth. It was WEST GERMANY who dominated the next event, the five man team, when after an opening set of 2759 they then proceeded to blast a 2957 for a fine total of 5716. Sweden were runners up again in front of Finland and Great Britain who had a poor opening 2601 but came back well with a 2800.

The top 16 scorers from the three events contested the All Events with the pinfall being carried over. Britain had four who qualified, namely NIGEL THOMPSON, PAUL SCOTTOW, DAVID FIELD and our own COLIN PEPLER and they finished 5th, 9th, 12th and 14th respectively with the crown going to WEST GERMANY'S B. KORNAK with 4758 pins just in front of P. KARLSSON of Sweden on 4741 and B. BAULE also of West Germany with a 4724.
