
BEXLEYHEATH SATURDAY PAIRS TOURNAMENT

NEW LAMINATE BOWLING LANES ARE APPROVED

A lot of maple and pine trees could well escape the woodman's axe with the American Bowling Congress approval of the new G.E.C. synthetic bowling lane surface. The shortage and high price of wood has been giving nightmares to bowling proprietors throughout the world for some time now, and in particular those whose lanes have received some 20 years hard use and are now beginning to show the nails. G.E.C's "fantastic plastic" as it has become known seems to be a solution to the wood problem and, in the process, could well cure many other lanes maintenance problems.

The lanes roll on to the old wooden ones after levelling and come in 8 parts from the approach to the pin deck and look and score exactly like a normal lane. The advantages to the proprietor are obvious. Less dressing needed, no lacquer required and resurfacing a thing of the past. To the bowler a much more consistent surface is promised with lane conditions more or less the same throughout the world and, more important, consistent as far as ball movement is concerned. The old "left handers have an advantage over right handers" controversy will be a thing of the past and there will be no worn lacquer, no black marks where lane oil has soaked through and no troughs or indentations of note. A minimum lane life will be about 7 years but, in practise, most sections should last for some 20 years with just the headers and pindeck sections being replaced. All the accepted lane markers are retained and, apart from quite a high gloss, the laminate look identical to wood apart from the fact that they will always look as if a resurface has just been completed. We look forward to the first installation in this country. DBA are marketing the product which could well be the salvation of the bowling industry in many parts of this country and in the world. The trade name is TEXTOLITE.

The 600, 500 and 200 Club annual club championships were held at Whitstable on 13th February and the best turnout to date was acheived with good scores throughout the day. Games of 243 - 180 - 234 gave BILLY PRESTON the 600 Club title without too much strain although team mate KEVIN RAISON bowled very well without very much luck for his runners-up total of 603. In the 500 Club DENISE RONDEAU bowled well above her average to capture the title with a 643 including handicap and EDITH CHALLONER was second on 613. In the 200 event - the best supported of them all - it was the turn of ANDY GAISH to take the club trophy with a handicap total of 650 closely chased by PAT OVERY on 642 and RALPH HUGHES with 628. JES Reminisces

JES MORLEY, Secretary of the Southend New Standard Fives League, has written to us regarding some of the personalities who bowl in the league who have made their mark in the sport in years gone by.

TERRY BELL was a member of the very first Great Britain team that competed in the FIQ World Championships in Mexico in 1963 and although now only a once a week competitor Terry still manages a very creditable 174 average for his team the Odd Balls who, at this time, top the league table.

CHUCK REED was one of the country's best known players in the early to mid 1960's and was a member of the Great Britain team that competed in the FIQ European Championships in Birmingham in 1965. It was here that the home country, showed the rest of Europe that we were going to have something to offer as regards international competition and our 5 lady team took the gold-medal which they have, in fact, held onto ever since. Our men won the gold in the doubles. setting a new tournament record for a single game with a 472 and also set a new, standard in the five man team game with a 994. A first international outing for Britain's TONY BLANCHETT was crowned with a fine silver medal in the All Events with the experienced Frenchman RENE FERRIE taking the gold. A year or so earlier Chuck had teamed up with another Southend bowler GERRY WARD of the original Tiny's Taxis team, to take part in the nationally sponsored TPBA tournament played at the Airport Bowl. With sponsors such as National Benzole, Playtex, Eagle Magazine and Pepsi Cola all the big names of the day were out in force from all parts of the country. Chuck and Gerry, however, held off all the opposition to take the doubles title with the Brunswick Jets duo of BOBBY MANSFIELD and NEIL OSBORNE in second position just 3 pins behind. This was a hard event to win and even harder to get into. Chuck is currently carrying an average of 171 but Gerry retired some years ago.

skippered the famous Harp Lager that included the man who shot this country's first ever sanctioned 700 series; KEN STUBBS. Still a force to be reckined with Bill is now a valued member of the SEBA Council.

absence. A member of the well known Gentlemen team, Graham always lived up to the name and is still renowned for his fighting spirit that is coupled with good sportsmanship. Graham is probably still the only player in the country who won his county qualifying trials but, for some reason unknown to us, was never invited to play. Maybe the 1977 Essex Trials at Southend on April 13th this year will put matters to rights after all this time? Graham is now playing with Chuck Reed in the Full House team and is curremtly holding an average of 17C.

The five names mentioned are just a few of what might be called the first generation of British bowlers. These names and, of course, many that have not been mentioned but are not forgotten were a part of the early tenpin scene in this country and set the standards for the present day and, hopefully, for the future. It was a good foundation.
