In a nail biting finish they managed to overhaul the Yorkshire team - who had led throughout in only the final two frames of the 11 game round robin final. CHRIS LEAVY, PETER BABOT, DAVE LEHRIAN, JES MORLEY, BILLY PRESTON and DAVE HOLDEN wore their Essex shirts with pride and the great team spirit born in the final qualifying round at Streatham was carried through to the finals at Coventry.

The first game was against the Hertfordshire team and good 200's from DAVE LEHRIAN and BILLY PRESTON assured the first points. Game two was against Yorkshire which Essex narrowly lost due to a 267 game from that county's Jack Smith. Surrey were then beaten 972 to 929 and the final game against Wales on the first day was a disaster being very low scoring on the pair of lanes that caused problems throughout the weekend. Two wins and two losses gave Essex fifth position on the Saturday night and they were aware that they could not afford to drop one further game if their ambition of

the county champions was to be realised.

After an excellent banquet on Saturday night the team turned out duly refreshed on Sunday morning and went about their task in style beating Dorset, Hampshire, Scotland and Co Durham and giving them second placing with one game to go; ; being equal with Yorkshire on points but with a slightly inferior pinfall. Essex now had to beat Staffordshire and Yorkshire had to lose to Hampshire or bowl a very bad game indeed. Essex duly came up with a Sunday grand slam and disposed of Staffs by 19 pins and in a frantic final frame the Hampshire men beat Yorkshire. had failed to convert a baby split! So the Essex six went up to collect the trophy and their medals. They gave a vote of thanks to ALAN SAMUELS who acted as the team manager for the weekend and Alan himself asks for a special mention to be made of DAVE LEHRIAN and BILLY PRESTON who both played surperbly for the complete tournament. Dave averaged over 190 and Billy over 187. Well done Essex - already SEBA's TEAM OF THE YEAR.
