AND 96p FROM THE 1978 AIRPORT 'NATIONALS"

The 17th annual B.T.B.A. Championships were the largest since the boom days of the sport when the 1966 event was held at the old Wembley bowl. An excellent entry this year, the second largest championsgips of all time and, in relation to the number of members, the largest ever. The Airport Bowl was the venue for the second time – the last occasion being 1963 – and high scoring was the order of the two complete weekends bowling with tournament records being smashed in all directions over the 24 lanes. S.E.B.A. members fared particularly well as recounted below:

REGULAR ALL EVENTS HANDICAP was won by PAUL SCOTTOW from Walton on Naze with team mate ROBIN GARTON the runner-up. Paul's average for his 9 championship games was a remarkable 214 with Robin Garton making 211. Very well done.

REGULAR ALL EVENTS SCRATCH was naturally won by PAUL SCOTTOW and the runner-up again was, of course, ROBIN GARTON. JOHN BASHAM again cashed.

LADIES ALL EVENTS HANDICAP was won by Pauline Bowry from Tolworth. LESLEY POTTER of Bexleyheath cashed in 4th slot.

LADIES ALL EVENTS SCRATCH was also taken by Pauline Bowry with a fine 198 nine game average with Jane Virot of Harrow second and LESLEY POTTER third.

REGULAR TEAM HANDICAP was won by the SCHLITZ ALL STARS from Dagenham with Walton's MARTELLO team fifth alongside the Dagenham SAINTS.

REGULAR TEAM SCRATCH was a S.E.B.A. benefit with the ALL STARS first on 3001 and MARTELLO the runners-up on 2946.

LADIES TEAM HANDICAP event ended in a two way tie between the Sea Hawks and the Olivettes with the HUSHAWAYS third; a team that contained JANET MORRISON and LESLEY POTTER.

LADIES TEAM SCRATCH was won by the HUSHAWAYS with 2625.

REGULAR SINGLES HANDICAP was won by John Ledner with a handicap total of 721. BILL SHEAD from Basildon was third with 715 and BRIAN FROST from Dagenham fifth on 705. CHAS BAULK of Bexleyheath.

REGULAR SINGLES SCRATCH was won by D. Harwood with a fine 699(oh for just one more pin!). RAY HOOK'S 647 came into 7th position, DOUG HARTLEY'S 629 was 11th, JOHN BASHAM rolled 608 for 20th slot and Prospect of the year MARTIN BOOTH from Southend totalled 607 for joint 21st place. LADIES DOUBLES HANDICAP needed a 1326 for the winning score and this was posted by Jane Virot and Pauline Bowry. LESLEY POTTER with Marie Beenham collected third position prize and JENNY MYHILL and CAROLE BROWN from Dagenham were 7th in the prize listings.

LADIES DOUBLES SCRATCH was also a victory for the Jane Virot/Pauline Bowlry combination with a fine 1212 and LESLEY POTTER was second on this occasion with Marie Beenham with 1137.
