INTER—CENTRE CHAMP'S WALTON

Walton win the Inter-Centre held this year at Cliftonville. Southend relinquished the trophy they won last year to a Walton team that gave a display of consistant bowling that must be admired. Event for event, the Junior fours was taken by Basildon with a creditable 2030, a fine performance by Robert Hobart, Mark Presley, Janet Day, and Paul Trickett- they beat Walton into second place by 215 pins. Cliftonville added to their first round total of five points by winning the Ladies Trios with Jackie Epps, Joan Cole and Ann Summers scoting 1488, with Walton second with 1373. After two rounds Cliftonville led with fifteen points, second were Basildon fourteen points, third Walton with two second places twelve points. Next the mens doubles, taken by the Walton pair Barry McGreggor and Bob Clark, Bob scoring the only 600 of the day, second to Barry and Bob was Basildon reversing the result of the Juniors. In the mixed doubles the honours were won by Dagenham with Crhis and Frank Brown beating Walton into second place I069 to I002. The standings after four events found Walton in the lead with 28 points. Cliftonville second with 23 points and Basildon third with 20 points. The Ladies singles provided the excitement of the day with Janet Morrison Bexleyheath, and Sue Ward Cliftonville bowling on lanes three and six - it all came down to the last frame where Janet could win if she spared. How often has it happened where the first ball of the last frame is so important? Janet bowled, and was left with a split which she failed to convert, and came second to Sue Ward 532 to 53I. Cliftonville's second win. The Mens singles was won by Dagenham's George Patel -George made 222 in his second game equalling Bob Clarke's second game in the mens doubles, again Walton was second with John Mills. With one event to go the standings were Walton 38, Cliftonville 36, Basildon 33, Dagenham 3I, Southend 24, Bexleyheath 20. The Bexleyheath team surprised them all with Alan Hutchinson, Chris White, Ted Shrimpton, Norman Weston, and Bob Whybrow they scored 2570 taking ten points, lifting the Bexleyheath team from the bottom of the tournament. Bob Whybrow scored 245 in his second game beating Bob Clarke's and George Patel's single game of 222 in their second game. Southend was second, with Walton third with five points and victory.
