QUALIFY FOR

COUNTY FINALS

SHEILA WHITE, CHRIS LODGE, DENESE KNAPP, DOT EDWARDS, EDITH CHALLONER, FRAN HONESS & JACKIE PLAYFORD, all members of the KENT LADIES IN TER-COUNTY 1981 TEAM: Not since the 'MAIDS OF KENT' during the ninteen sixties has a KENT LADIES team qualified. After the first round at Worthing they had played six and had a points total of 10. Bexleyheath was the venue for the second round, they were to play ESSEX, SUSSEX, BERKSHIRE, LONDON, MIDDX, & SURREY. They had a chance to assess the opposition for they had a bye in the first round. ESSEX was their first test, by the 6th frame there was only 3 pins separating the teams, but a poor finish by the Kent Ladies cost them two points. They made up for lost ground with victories over SUSSEX & BERKSHIRE. Three games to go and 14 points to their credit - LONDON were next, they led the points table with 16 points, Kent were second with 14, it was 'Crunch Time', the difference between the two teams at the sixth frame was 60 pins - by the tenth frame London had recovered some of the deficit, but not enough to win. Kent then lost to MIDDX & SURREY, and finished with 16 points, second to LONDON with 18. At the end of the day both London & Kent Ladies had qualified for the 1981 finals.

600 GHAMPION GUU ROBERT HOBART 694

ROBERT HOBART on his home lanes opened his assault on the 600 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP with 190 - his second game started 9 spare, strike, 9 miss, then seven in a row, 8 spare for 246. To us mere mortals our days work would be nearly done, and with some satisfaction. Not so with Robert. Third game and he hits his mark with uncanny accuracy, the ball goes around the first arrow, along the edge of the lane, then moves at least thirteen boards into the pocket for a third game that read, 9 spare, three in a row, 9 spare, five in a row, 9 spare for 258, and a three game total of 694. Robert at 14 becomes the youngest 600 CLUB CHAMPION, and the Youngest Bowler to be Invited to the SEBA MASTERS, Possibly the youngest SEBA MASTERS CHAMPION. On The County Trail

The second round of the Inter-County Championships was held at Bexleyheath, where SUSSEX, LONDON, KENT, MIDDX, SURREY, ESSEX & BERKSHIRE, renewed the battle that had been adjourned from Worthing, all teams had played six games, and Kent Ladies had the better of the exchanges at Worthing with 10 points. Essex Ladies with 8 points were in close contention: The Kent & Essex Men with 6 points apiece, therefore all SEBA teams were well placed. The standings prior to the days competition was;- The Ladies, KENT 10 points, ESSEX, LONDON & SUSSEX 8 points, SURREY 6, MIDDX 2 & BERKSHIRE O. The Men: SURREY & SUSSEX 10 points, ESSEX & KENT 6, LONDON & MIDDX 4, & BERKSHIRE 2. All the pundits had gone to ground as to the outcome, all we could have, was even money the field. Kent Ladies booked their ticket to Acocks Green this October with a steady display of bowling that failed to underline their Worthing performance, none the less they have qualified. For the rest, their stories follow:- Kent Men their first match was against Surrey, each team was scoring well, and strod on 'picture count' 46 to 44 in favour of Surrey by the 9th frame - all to play for in the 10th, three players finished and Kent had a lead of 31 pins, 220 by Jez Darvill closed the deficit and gained 10 pins. John Amos at anchor counting a strike in the 9th was looking for a big finish - he closed the 10th with three in row for 217, and Kent's men had won their first game by three pins. Their luck and promise left them against Sussex and they lost 880 to 936. Middx. hit their highest game against them with 1001 to 952, and they fared no better against Berkshire. Their fortunes changed against London to take their points total to 10. Essex ended their hopes of going to Acocks Green by defeating them 870 to 929. 10 points and out of the competition until next year. ESSEX MEN; - Their first game produced a close finish against Middx, frame by frame they stayed level, by the 5th they were 24 'pictures' across. Essex made 4 'pictures' by the ninth and led 46 to 42 - Middx were in the best position for a big finish, their first three players had strikes in the 9th, for Essex with strikes in the 9th was Dave Lehrian & Billy Preston, I Buckland closed the 10th with a double then 9 for 198. Pete Babot finished with three in a row for a fine 229, the scores by then read Essex 595, Middx 582, with two scores each to count, A Lloyd added 202 for Middx, Mick Matthews opened for 181 and it was all down to Billy Prest on and Geoff Buck. Geoff waited for Billy to bowl 8 spare 4, made the task look easy for Geoff, but the gods were with Essex, Geoff's ball was to high in the pocket and left the 6-4 split, Geoff removed one, and Essex won by 9 pins, and we all began to breath again. Against Surrey they had a 49 pin victory lost to London & Sussex, defeated Berkshire & Kent for a 14 pin total. There was an outside chance that Essex Men could qualify if London could vanquish Surrey: That match was in doubt down to Surrey's last ball, 7 to loss, 8 to draw, 9 to win. We all held our breath again for the second time that day for Essex, 9 required 9 obtained. Surrey & Sussex had qualified. Essex were

ESSEX LADIES:- their first game was against London, the teams were evenly matched by the 5th frame they were 17 'pictures' across. London by the 9th had gained 3 'pictures' Essex were still in with a chance, Ciss Collings opened the 10th to match her London opposite. Sheila Staines 8 spare 7 and gained 10 pins, Ruth Molineaux with an open in the 9th closed the 10th with a double then 8, only to be matched by Sandy Sawyer with a double and 5. The scores after three players 431 to 428 in favour of Essex. Sue Portsmouth with a steady 185 and only one open frame made it 616 after 4, one score each to count, Joan Nutt closed the 10th frame with a double then 8, could not hold off the challenge of fellow SEBA Council Member Jan Hodge playing for London, and Essex lost. Next it was Essex Ladies v Kent Ladies. Ciss Collings, Ruth Molineaux and Sheila Staines found form, and by the 5th frame the team was 3 'pictures' up, and maintained this lead until the end, to add 2 points to their total. They lost against Surrey, 234 by Pauline smith, a 205 by Sue Overall for Surrey gave them no chance. Next was Middx, Sue Wandless replaced Joan Nutt at anchor, Sheila Staines made up for the previous game by starting with 4 in a row for 216. Sue Wandless closed the 10th with three in a row for 181, and they swamped Middx 850 to 717. They continued their up and down form by losing to Berkshire, then defeating Sussex for a 14 point total, and out of the competition until next year.
