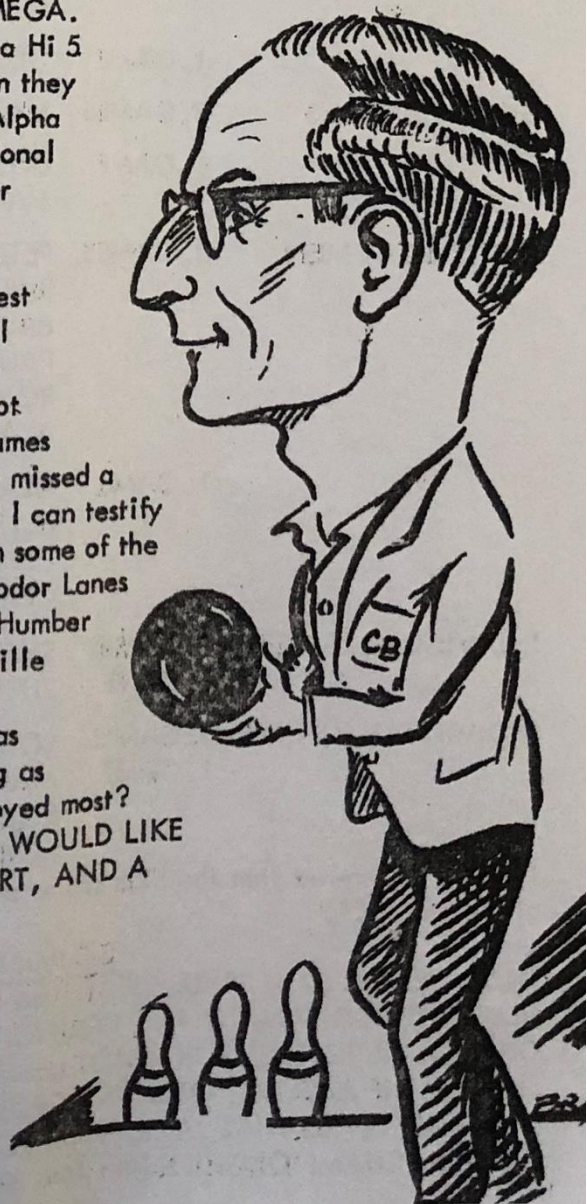
'Our TEN-PIN'

Recently at the completion of a game Chas Baulk took out a small note pad and entered his game, at the completion of our nights bowling he entered his last game, and totaled his series. It occurred to me that I had witnessed this ritual since 1963: I asked Chas if he had kept his record since 1963? He replied that he had: Before Bexleyheath opened in 1963 the Bowl Proprietor A.B.C. invited local sports clubs to Bexleyheath for a free game as part of their opening promotion - in 1965 BURNDIPT ELECTRONICS published an article on CHARLIE BAULK in their magazine titled 'Our Tenpin Expert'. They explained how Chas had attended the pre-opening promotion, and reported his progress from 1963 to 1965. How he had joined the 'Fireball League' at this point in our story enter yours truly. I had joined the league on the 2nd week of their schedule, and had gone along to Bexleyheath to practice. I was looking for a ball when I noticed that Chas had his own ball, a rare sight unless you were a league bowler of some standing. I asked him if he would like to join another league? "Another league" he replied, "I don't belong to any league, and would like to" We formed the "TWISTERS" a dance craze I recall, a team name Chas has retained to this day for his Saturday night team. It was not long before he was amongst the awards, Jan & Feb badges for 225 & 200 games and later that year a watch from the Pepsi Cola Tournament for a 230 game. In 1965 a trophy for the most improved bowler in the Fireball League: He soon joined other leagues, first being the Early Birds a 9.30am Sunday league and Captained the "Union Men" and played for the Fireball Team XL5. From 63 to 81 he has been a member of successful teams in the Concorde, Hits & Missess, Invicta & Olympic Leagues at Bexleyheath, and is still a member of the Olympic League bowling for ALPHA OMEGA. He featured in the ROBINS when they set the Kent Area Hi 5 man team game at 1029!! Again with the ROBINS when they won the SEBA Regular Team Championships (HC) with Alpha Omega at Leeds when they made 4th in the BTBA National Championships, and the same year 1974 at Southend for another SEBA Regular Team Championships. His most memorable games are 6 x 8 split 1, 5 x - 266 & 9 spare X 9 spare 8 x 7 - 267 all recorded of course. His highest series 654 was also his first 600 and remains his personal best: Chas started bowling when he was 47, and had no interest in sport before he started bowling, and has kept a record of all of his league scores, has played 5518 games and scored 90527 pins an average of 164. He has never missed a game through illness, only through being dropped, and I can testify that is not often. Amongst his trophies are badges from some of the centres where he has bowled - pure nostalger - Ambassador Lanes Edgware, Basildon, Lewisham, Worthing, Hounslow, Humber Lanes at Sheffield, Crawley, Southend, Excel Cliftonville Brunswick Lanes Airport, Magnet Bowl Poole, and the New Regal Bowl Essex. The Dolphin Club Walton. Chas is now 65 and a man of leisure, and enjoys his bowling as much now as when he started. I asked him what he enjoyed most? He replied "The Game and the people" CHAS BAULK I WOULD LIKE TO THANK YOU FOR BEING A CREDIT TO OUR SPORT, AND A GREAT SPORTSMAN.
