As Editor of SEBA's Bowling News I agree with TenPin News in their article Right to Write and I quote, "every member has the right to write, although it does not follow that TenPin News will have the right to publish any correspondence which may be likely to cause offence or encourage disputes. The dividing line between these two factors may get a little

thin from time to time, but using the yardstick of if it is fact, and of general interest - Publish - we should not drift to the wrong side intentionally. . . . With courage of his convictions said member wrote to the Bowl Director, and forwarded a copy to 'TN' for publication. Unfortunately the correspondence in question appears to have been infavourable received as various verbal ultimatums resulted, and to conclude Walton TenPin News published the Letter that critised the editors of Bowling News for making Walton Bowl of the Year, and suggested that we would pay a visit to our opticitions, and visit Walton in the Winter without our thermal underwear." Now it is is not for me to aggravate this situation, but I understand that all the copies of Walton's TenPin news has been confiscated by the bowl manage-ment. Action that can only be described as Drastic. Have they not heard of the right to reply. As editor of Bowling News I exercise that right on my behalf now.

Another reason for our choice is the number of Tournaments that are staged at Walton, with guaranteed prize funds, ten such tournament in 1982. We decided that such services deserved recognition.

It is my fervant hope that Walton Bowl Management excerises it's Right to reply in Walton TenPin News, and Status Quo returns.
