Our balance sheet showed that members throughout SEBA between 1st September 1981 until 31st August 1982 had contributed £1215.06. Basildon £76.16, Bex-leyheath £538.78, Cliftonville £56.46, Dagenham £244.92, Southend £57.20, Walton on Naze £191.84 and Whistable £49.70.

At the meeting the delegates agreed to accept an increase to SEBA Budget for the current year from £1700.00 to £2050.00. It is expected that this amount to be expended as follows:

Stationery, postage, printing & paper £700.00. Telephone £150.00. Intercounties for Kent & Essex £375.00. Administration £200.00. Engraving and purchase of Trophies £125.00. Between the 1st September and 31st £6885.87 passed through the SEBA Accounts in Tournament entry fees, prize payments, expenditure against our budget.
