Now pay attention all you unsanctioned leagues, all you have to do is a few minutes work to complete the sanction application, send it to the BTBA and they will do the rest. If you make a mistake they will advise you of your error, and return your application. If you are still at a loss to know what to do, the Area Secretary will be only too pleased to assist. If you are unsanctioned at the moment, you are no doubt using materials that have been supplied by the BTBA, but you have decided to be unsanctioned, and as no doubt you believe you have a conscience, you should have sent all that back, for you have decided to go it alone. Calling all League members of unsanctioned leagues. If you have been persuaded by your league officers to go, or remain unsanctioned, get rid of them. They are not doing you any favours. 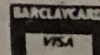

An incredible game for someone who is physically handicapped! Other scores from the New Beach Cash League are all just outside the Area Hi's. Den Elliott 248, 186, 188 for 622. Kevin Elliott 209, 202, 182 for 593. Ray Hunt 235 single game. Mervyn Hogg 232, 178, 184 for 594. Howard Green 246, 199, 199 for 644. Dave Adams 243 game, 612 series. Karen Hewitt 214 game, Brian Green 244 game 680 series and into the Area Hi's.

Roger Smith from Ipswich bowled his first league 700 series on May 27, with games of 236, 277, 192 for 705.
