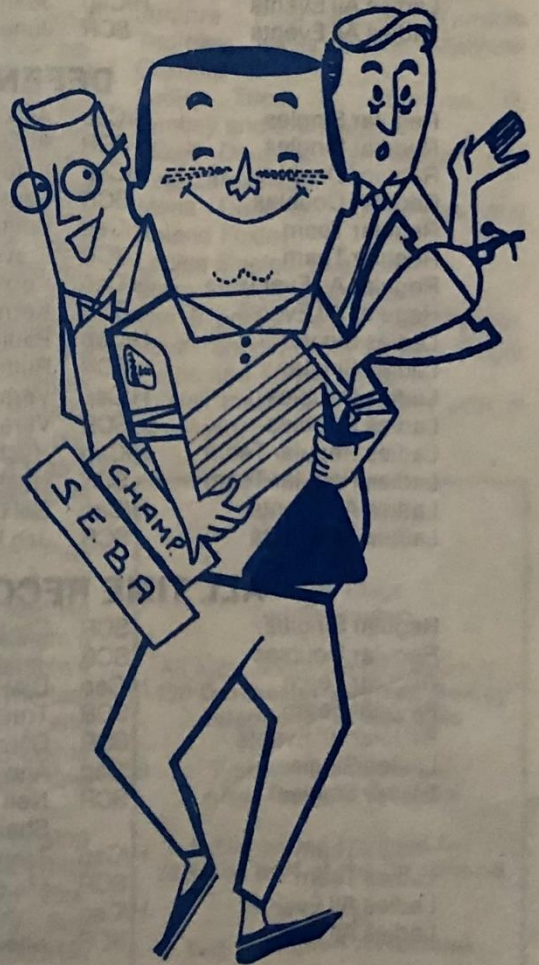

# Inter Centre Championships 1984

109 Bowlers from 6 centres met at Whitstable to compete for the Inter Centre Trophy won by Basildon last year. Each centre had chosen its 18 member team with great care, for this the 10th year of this popular match. Whitstable on home ground fancied their chances, but Bexleyheath were determined to return the trophy to where it had been 5 times previously. Basildon the 1983 Champions were hoping to make it a double. Cliftonville had assembled a strong team to win the trophy for this first time; Dagenham for the second time and a very welcome return of Southend.

The first event was the Junior 4's, Bexleyheath and Basildon had been drawn on lanes 1 and 2. Bexleyheath's Elaine Lodge and Basildon's Robert Hobart, both recently selected for the U.K. Youth Team in this years European Championship, were competing for their respective centres. First game and Basildon had established a healthy lead over Bexleyheath, with 210 from Rob Hobart. 62 pins separated Basildon from Bexleyheath, Dagenham was third. Game two and the kids from Bexleyheath reduced the deficits to 53 pins. Over on lanes 3 & 4 Mickey Maher from Dagenham was setting them alight, his game looked all set for a 200 plus when an open frame in the 9th left him with 182, so he had to spare the 10th frame and score more than 8 to hit 200. He did just that, much to Mickey's relief. Third and last game, Basildon had lost their lead by the 4th frame, Bexleyheath were making a bold bid for victory. All down to the last frame, a double from Elaine would have put Rob under pressure, but it was not to be, 9 spare 9 from Rob was sufficient to take the first game and 10 points for Basildon's Sharon Carter, Robert Hobart, Peter Lee and Jason Muller. 6 points Bexleyheath, 5 Dagenham, 4 Whitstable, 3 Cliftonville and 2 Southend.

Event 2 the Ladies Trios, and the three J's from Cliftonville led from start to finish. They were never in trouble and won by 38 pins. Well done Jill Badlwin, Jill Grimes & Joan Cole. 2nd Bexleyheath, 3rd Dagenham, 4th Whitstable, 5th Basildon, 6th Southend. High game and series to Marge Lazarus 214. 544 from Dagenham.

The Men's Doubles became a struggle between Cliftonville and

Whitstable. Laurie Walmsley and Don Turner had the advantage after two games for Cliftonville by two pins. What a match this would have been if they had been head to head. Bob Potts for Whitstable hit 202 in his last game, his partner Roland Foxley 189, to make their last game 391, for a 1096 doubles series. Laurie Walmsley and Don Turner replied with 204 - 172, finished only 13 pins behind. Dagenham 3rd, Bexleyheath 4th, Basildon 5th, Southend 6th.

The Mixed Doubles and Whitstable were to notch their second win with Lyn Purcell and Paul Zakrezewski. They had a 23 pin lead after two games, a lead they were not to lose. Lyn scored 560 the Hi series of this second. But the heroes of the mixed doubles were the Southend pair Caroline Ward and Richard Barker. They were last after two games with only 555. Their first time away from Southend and feeling the excitement of the day, started to put their games together in the last game. Richard scored 107, Caroline 188 to pull themselves into 4th place. It was a pleasure to see their satisfaction in playing well.

The Men's Singles and Paul Crundel from Cliftonville led the field after two games with 389. He was being chased by Dagenham's Dave Lehrian, and Whitstable's Sean Purcell both on 363. The last game and Sean went potty and scored 256 for 619 and 10 points for Whitstable, and their 3rd first place.

The Ladies Singles was to stop their run of wins when Sheila White won the Ladies singles for Bexleyheath from Whitstable's Sue Trott. Sue had started well with 215, and had scored 377 after 2 games.

Sheila scored 192, 189 for 381 and 203 game, for a 584 series. Sue came 2nd for 6 points, 3rd Marion Drury (Basildon), 4th Ruth Molineaux (Southend), 5th Joan Nutt (Dagenham), 6th Anne Simons (Cliftonville). Sue's 2nd place had secured for Whitstable an unassailable position. They had 44 points to Bexleyheaths 32, Cliftonville and Dagenham 30, Basildon 28 and Southend 19.

The remaining event, the five person team and only pride and 2nd place to play for, Bexleyheath started well with a first game of 915 but Whitstable caught them in the 2nd game, the scores read 1744 to Whitstable, 1741 to Bexleyheath. Dagenham made a last ditch effort to take 2nd place, Cliftonville also overtook Bexleyheath for 3rd place in the 5's. Whitstable had won the SEBA Inter Centre 1984 Championships.

# SEBA A.G.M. 1984

THE 1984 SEBA AGM was held at the Bexley Crook Log Sports Centre on February 11th to consider the past year in the activities of our Association. The meeting was well attended, and gave full support to all the reports they heard.

The Area Secretary John Cudmore reported the number of sanctioned leagues as 86, with one or two leagues still awaiting sanction for one reason or another. John had one personal statement to add to his report, when he reminded delegates that he was not a **FULL TIME OFFICIAL**, and that he performed his duties as Area Secretary during his spare time, that is, nearly all his spare time!!

The Audit and Finance report revealed that the Executive and Council had stayed within its budget and received from the members in 3p contributions £2137.86 from 1st September 1982 to 31 August 83. Basildon had contributed £158.62, Bexleyheath £881.37, Cliftonville £91.83, Dagenham £419.00, Southend £208.72, Walton £304.34, Whitstable £37.98. The balance sheet for that period was duly accepted without dissent.

The Awards and Tournament report was given by the Area Secretary and advised that the 21st SEBA Championships at Southend was a success, as were all the SEBA Tournaments during the past year. The Meeting heard how the Essex Ladies in the Inter-County Championships had reached the finals. Whilst Kent equipped themselves well they were not to make the trip in 1983.

The Junior Sub Committee report was most enlightening as to the continuing growth of the NAYBC around SEBA, with the distinct possibility of the re-institution of the

SEBA Junior Championships. We were advised that three SEBA Juniors had been selected for the UK Junior team in the forthcoming European Junior Championships, accompanied by Brian Molineaux as team coach and Jerry Lodge as Team Manager. Good news indeed for our Association.

The election of the SEBA Council saw the re-election of Brian Langford, Roy Myhill, Brian Molineaux, Joan Nutt, Lyn Purcell, Brian Morrison, Keith Hodge and Richard Post. One well known name is missing from that list and that is Bill Ainger. Bill resigned from the SEBA Council last December, and his absence from the SEBA Council will leave a void that will be difficult to fill. Coming on to the SEBA Council for the first time was Val Sumner from Basildon and with the departure of Bill Ainger, as Basildon's Bowl Rep. Val now assumes his duties. Roland Foxley from Whitstable and Trevor Myhill also from Whitstable were elected to the SEBA Council. Any other business concluded the meeting.

At the following E.G.M. it was decided that Ted Shrimpton for Kent and Brian Molineaux for Essex be nominated for election to the BTBA National Council. Finally eight delegates were elected to attend the 1985 BTBA AGM.

After the AGM & EGM had been completed, the renewed SEBA Council met to elect the SEBA Executive and committees. During the

election of the sub-committees it was decided to elect not only an Inter-County organiser, but Inter-County selection committees with representatives from each centre, and it was agreed in principle to reinstate the Essex Challenge after the County Trials had been held. This event will be for the fifteen bowlers that are registered for the Mens and Ladies teams for both counties.

## Yuletide Trios

Entries into the above event were excellent and brought about a total prize fund payout of £730 as against the guarantee of £500.

With 85 - 200 games and 15 - 600 series, this was a high scoring individual event but with few exceptions only the individuals failed to 'get it together' in the same entry.

The Apaches team of Geoff Plumb, Audrey Pond and John Ransome, were the early leaders with 1859 including handicap, just ahead of B.T. Products, with 1848. Last year's winners, North Western Securities, despite series of 615 and 611 from Rick Caldwell, failed to cash on this occasion and it appeared that the Menagerie team of American Service men from Lakenheath were going to scoop the pool, laying prior to the final squad in first, second and fifth places. The Travellers side of Mark Presley, Peter Babot and Mick Matthews, however, bowling in the very final squad of the event had other ideas and with Mark firing 634, Mick 603 and Peter 594 their excellent scratch series of 1831 gave them the Championship and the £325 cheque with a handicap total of 2014.

High Series of the event went to Billy Bullock with 654, closely followed by Paul Mayor 653, Mark Presley 634 and Jim Doremus with 623. The High Game of the event was hit by Alan Maskell with 251, followed by Paul Mayor 248, Mick Matthews 245, Don Stanley 243, Billy Bullock 239, Mike Connor 238, Gordon Phillips 236, Pat Duggan 236, Simon Brown 234, Tom Owen 234, Dave Lok 233, Ray Valerio 232, David Yoxall 232, Jim Doremus 231, Paul Phillips 227, Bob Hayter 224, Ron Oldfield 224.
