THE SOUTH EASTERN BOWLING ASSOCIATION OF THE B.T.B.A.

The B.T.B.A. charters of Southend Area and Kent Area have been withdrawn by the B.T.B.A. Council and the seven bowling centres are now merged under this new title. S.E.B.A. now comprises Ambassador Basildon, A.B.C. Bexleyheath, Top Rank Chatham, Excel Cliftonville, Chantal Grays, Excel Southend and Excel Whitstable. This amalgamation will strenghten the association in every way and will give bowlers on both sides of the Thames new opposition in the larger area tournaments that can now be run. The Dartford Tunnel makes travelling between the centres an easy matter and in fact the nearest centre to Grays in route miles would appear to be Bexleyheath, irrespective of the Thames in between!

All three of the centres North of the Thames have lanes certified by the B.T.B.A. for the Season 1966/67 and with Whitstable also in the same position we have at least 4 of the 7 centres fully operative for sanctioned tournaments, of which many will be

promoted by the Area in the Season ahead.

The league programme for the coming season is already well advanced in a number of our centres and this applies whether or not the lanes have been B.T.B.A. certified. Following the emergency measures taken by the B.T.B.A. Council it is permissable for sanctioned leagues to roll upon uncertified lanes but with the obvious proviso that high score recognition cannot be given until the bowlers association once again, has the right to ensure that everything with regard to the lanes, pins and machinery is as it should be. Leagues that sanction on uncertified lanes will still receive the full services and protection of their association, however and some of these advantages were described in the recent S.E.B.A. Communique which mentioned:-

1. All members will receive their new membership cards permitting them to bowl in any sanctioned league or tournament anywhere in Great Britain.

2. Leagues will receive a full league kit which includes Playing Rules and Regulations, Standing Sheets, Record Cards, Handicap Manual, Average Calculator and League Schedules etc etc.

3. B.T.B.A. free insurance coverage for your league funds and area funds.
4. Newly designed S.E.B.A. Award Eadges catering for all standards of player.

The Area Discount Service allowing members large savings on all types of purchases and giving you the opportunity of recouping your membership dues many times over in the course of any season.

The Area High Score Award Programme with divisions for ladies, juniors and all bowlers covering 5 person, 4 person, 3 person, Doubles, Mixed Doubles and Singles - assuring you of local recognition for your season's achievements or the achievements of your team. This programme culminates in handsome plaques being awarded to the winners in every division.

7. Fully organised and sanctioned tournament programme covering Singles, Doubles, Trios and 5 person teams - scratch and handicap to allow for all tastes and at the same time all existing tournaments from both the old Southend and Kent

Areas to be continued. The monthly issue of this publication which is free to all and is distributed through your league secretary. Read about your achievements, about new World Records, about National Tournaments and all items of interest to you, the bowler, giving local, national and international tenpin coverage.

9. 16mm sound film shows on bowling - both colour and black and white. See the American champions in action as well as players from this country.

10. The service and friendliness of your local association - always on hand and only too pleased to assist with any problem or query you or your league may have. Call in the association to decide any issue on an unbiased basis. In this way leagues stay friendly and bowlers dont fight among themselves. THIS IS YOUR ASSOCIATION - USE IT TO THE FULL - IT WILL PAY YOU IN THE END.

With seven centres now available to enter a team or te League should be stronger still for the coming season. Teams or individuals from Basildon, Bexleyheath, Chatham, Cliftonville, Grays, Southend and Whitstable are invited to submit applications to Brian Langford,

This is yet another example of how the B.T.B.A. has leant over backwards to please our proprietors in this country. Despite being a member of the B.T.B.A. there is nothing to stop you rolling in an unsanctioned league or tournament - apart from your common sense of course!!!!!!

# BARBARIANS WIN MINT TRAVEL LEAGUE OUTRIGHT

No details at the time of going to press but we understand that the BARBARTANS from Bexleyheath, who won the Northern Division of this league have played the Souther victors and emerged victorious. Congratulations and more details next month.

EIGHTY FIVE WHOLE DAYS HAVE PASSED since the proprietors announced that only surveyors would be allowed to certify their lanes for the future. In this time how many centres have been measured by these professional men? To the best of our knowledge and belief ONE! If this rate of action continues it will be some 37 years before all the centres in this country have been measured! So much for the apparant concern that all centres should be professionally measured for the new season. The new season commenced 6 days ago and even the one centre that has been visited by the surveyors does not display a certificate!

If and when a certificate is issued what will it contain? Apparantly the surveyors measure the lanes but they do not actually certify that they conform to B.T.B.A. specifications. The proprietors, at the present time, refuse to allow the B.T.B.A. to see the measurements and the proprietors, themselves, intend to check the surveyors figures and sign the certificate to the effect that the lanes and equipment fall within specifications! If we are to trust the proprietors in this respect why are not the B.T.B.A. allowed to see the forms? It has been suggested that on this

basis the certificates will not be worth the paper they are written on.

The cost to the proprietors of using qualified surveyors is a matter for them That the cost is quite formidable will be obvious when it is realised that alone. the two senior partners of a well known City firm undertook the first inspection. It is now understood, however, that the fees are to be drastically reduced. Does this mean that the surveying firms are to sub-contract the task for the future? If so can we expect to revert to square one with unqualified men doing the job? If builders or the like are now to be used this will be the case. The whole position appears quite mad - the're coming to take me away - ha! haa!!

WHAT ARE THE N.T.B.C. PLAYING RULES?

The Editorial of our June issue referred to the circulation of a tournament entry form that stated that the playing rules of the National Tenpin Bowling Council would govern the tournament. It was pointed out that the N.T.B.C. do not have any playing rules! Since the proprietors have decreed that nome of their members shall seek B.T.B.A. sanction for any tournament that they promote they are obviously at a loss as to which rules their tournaments can operate under. A number of other entry forms are now being circulated mentioning the playing rules of the N.T.B.C. and we must mention again that the N.T.B.C. do not have any rules. What is apparantly confusing the proprietors is a booklet published by the N.T.B.C. for beginner bowlers. With the written acknowledgement and permission of the B.T.B.A. their basic playing rules were mentioned BUT ONLY ON THE CLEAR UNDERSTANDING THAT THE BOOKLET WOULD NOT BE USED BY THE PROPRIETORS TO PROMOTE ANY NON-SANCTIONED LEAGUES OR TOURNAMENTS. agreement seems to have been forgotten by them but in any event they should be reminded that the booklet in question does not contain any TOURNAMENT RULES. Over to you gentlemen!

# TIME MARCHES ON!

The Operations Manager of Excel Bowling, Mr Mike Bentley and the B.T.B.A. General Secretary, Mr Morris Glazer, discussed their respective differences at an open meeting of the league bowlers at Cliftonville on Sunday, 28th. August.

Many questions were fired at both gentlemen and the majority of those present came away much wiser than when they arrived. Mr Bentley stated that it was his job to give his customers what they wanted and was left in little doubt that the league

bowlers at Cliftonville wanted their lanes to be certified by the B.T.B.A.

The position with regard to the surveyor's measurements being submitted to the B.T.B.A. for ratification was left unresolved but Mr Bentley did agree to put the point before his Directors. The outcome is not yet known but as this appears the only remaining hurdle to a peaceful solution of the respective problems we keep our fingers crossed particularly as some of the largest leagues at this centre have already indicated that they will not bowl until the position is clarified.

The attitude of the bowlers is understandable when it is remembered that the lanes at this centre have not been certified for the new season by either of the two interested parties. This situation also applies to the Top Rank Bowl, Chatham. Meanwhile time marches on! The bowlers are confused and the Area Executive have their hands tied with regard to the new season. Normally this time of the year is productive with new and old leagues being helped on their way and tournament venues being decided. Unless something is resolved without further delay it is almost certain that the B.T.B.A. will lose members who find something else to do with their spare time and these same people will be lost forever to the proprietors as customers. IN THE INTEREST OF TENPIN BOWLING PLEASE DON'T DELAY ANY LONGER. TIME RUNS OUT !

The B.T.B.A. Certificate covering the lanes and equipment at A.B.C. Bexleyheath expired at midnight on 31st August. The first league scheduled to bowl on 1st September on lanes that no more carried a certificate of any kind, was the 70 strong OLYMPIC LEAGUE. Even the National Dailies were interested in the situation and reports appeared in, among others, the Daily Mirror, Daily Sketch and Evening News.

The word "strike" was used by the press but of course only paid employees can take this kind of action - all that happened was that the bowlers in the league voted to postpone the start of their Winter Schedule until October. This was in the form of a token protest to the proprietors concerned but in any event they had already rolled throughout the hot Summer months and many will say that they more than honoured their obligations to A.B.C. by bowling for 48 weeks out of 52.

That the league would normally have continued through September there is little doubt but when, on 1st. September, no certificate was displayed at the centre, either from B.T.B.A. or the Proprietors/Surveyors the league decided by vote that they could not bowl. The same position would have faced any of the Bexleyheath leagues had their schedule fallen on 1st September but it is the Olympic League that has borne the brunt of the publicity. The fact that the remaining leagues at this centre have now voted to take the same action does not appear to be newsworthy.
