This year the SEBA Junior Championships will include a Section for our Young Adult Bowlers, 17-23 inclusive.

The Junior Section will continue its present format, six Classified Divisions with a Team Prize for the best team performance over any four of the six Divisions. Age limit: Under 18 at the qualifying date.

Our new Youth Section will be a Scratch Event over six games, ladies' and Men's divisions, open to SEBA bowlers in the 17-23 age group. Seventeen-year-olds may bowl in either Junior or Youth Sections, but not both.
