Three bowlers had an opening game over 200, Lyn Purcell and Marion Drury with 203 and Jackie Playford, on her home lanes sweeping into the lead with a 217 plus 55 bonus to give her 272.

In the second game, Jackie slipped down the field as Joan Nutt slotted in a 229 game to take the lead by 9 pins from Sandy Sawyer.

Jackie Playford struck back in the third game, if that it is the correct phrase, with a 200 game and 55 bonus to regain the lead from Sheila White and Ruth Molineaux. Then in the fourth, Irene Dummett climbed from fifth to first place with the highest game of the Competition, a 258, to open up a 38 pin lead from Jackie Playford going into the last game. With each bowler closely watching the others score, Jackie bowled a 198 game but Irene kept close all the way finishing on 187 to take the title while Sandy Sawyer climbed into third place with a 202.

There were only 2 bowlers who opened with a 200 game, Ken Barnard with a 207 and Mark Bird taking the lead with 210. After the second game, Mark retained the lead with a 204 game but Sean Purcell closed the gap to 4 pins with a 216 game. Sean then swept into the lead with a 225 in the third, Steve White climbing to second place with a 243 game, the highest of the competition, and Mark slipping to third.

Sean held on to first place after a fourth game where he rolled a 201 game but there was such a tussle for the minor placings. Sean had opened up a gap of 157 pins from John Mills in second place and Brian Greene in third. The title winner was now a formality and Sean cruised to victory with a very moderate game but Mark Bird fought back to finish in second place with a 214 game with Terry Hewitt finishing third.

Last year, the Secretary of the Travelling League, Chas Dummett was driving to one of the Tournaments in the area with his wife and obviously being pleased with the way the Travelling League had settled down turned to his wife, Irene, and said 'Wouldn't it be nice if we could take the League for a trip to the States'. The instant reply was 'Why not'.

After a few letters and phone calls, contacts had soon been

established, considerable interest aroused among SEBA bowlers, and even to a large number of bowlers outside the SEBA area, plans made and deposits collected from those who wanted to go on the trip.

Chas has recently been over the America to finalise the arrangements and the outline programme is:

Wednesday 22nd July 1987.

Fly out from Gatwick by Virgin Atlantic to Newark, New

Jersey with coaches picking up passengers from Cliftonville, Bexleyheath and Grays.

On arrival in Newark, coaches will be waiting to take the party on a 3 hour journey through New York and out to Hartford, Connecticut in New England to the Hotel where they will be based for the whole fortnight. This is a large hotel complex and it looks like SEBA will occupy one complete wing.

On the first day, time is basically allowed for everyone to recover from the journey and get over their jet lag, except for an opportunity to visiting a Bowling equipment manufacturer to purchase equipment and try it

out in the adjacent Bowl under the guidance of professionals.

From then on, life gets hectic. Bowling matches have been arranged for most evenings with extensive sight-seeing trips during the day, all on a package tour arrangement with a Coach company.

Junior Jottings

What a year 1986 has been for Neil Webb of Bexleyheath.

In Junior Bowling in this Country, there are two major individual prestige Tournaments being the Junior Masters at Airport and the Junior Classic Invitation Singles this year held at Leeds. Competition is always very keen with the leading Junior Bowlers doing their utmost to impress selectors for ultimate places in International Teams. NEIL WEBB won both events.

In the Junior Masters, the Tournament has two Classified Divisions and in Division 1 for the higher average bowlers, six games are bowled in the qualifying round with the top eight going through to a Round Robin Final. This year three bowlers from the SEBA area qualified, namely Neil Webb and David Petherick from Bexleyheath and Dean Saunders from Southend.

The cut off was 1062 (average 177.0) and Nick Mullins from Bexleyheath just missed the final by 4 pins having rolled 1058.

In the final both Neil and David started with 200 games and the 10 pins bonus given to the winners of each game. After a moderate second game, David rolled 215 in his third and Neil then had a 231 in his fourth. When they met in the fifth David won a tense tight game 160/157 but then fell away and eventually finished in sixth place. Meanwhile Dean had been bowling steadily without hitting any high games and finally ended in fifth place.

Coming into the position round Neil was lying second 72 pins behind Alan Toogood from Brize Norton. It looked all over to everyone, except Neil who strung strikes together in the last game for a 235 against Alan's 169 to take the title by 4 pins.

Poor Alan could not believe it, but I am sure he will be back to fight another day.

There was also three bowlers from SEBA who qualified for the 8 person Round Robin Final in Division 2 for the lower average bowlers. Steven Dodd from Bexleyheath, Richard Webster and Denis Quirke from Dagenham. Your reporter was watching the Division 1 final at the time so can only rely on the final scores to report that Denis Quirke finished as runner-up to Graham Crouch (Airport) and Richard Webster was third. Unfortunately, Steven Dodd skinned his thumb during the Final, had to retire and was placed eighth.

The Classic Invitation Singles was held at Leeds, the invitations being based on finishing positions in the NAYBC Junior Nationals Singles section in the various age Groups for both Boys and Girls. The full results are not yet to hand but will be published in the next issue. Neil

Webb was competing in the Graduate Boys event and after nine games found himself in another Round Robin Final. Again he was lying second going into the final game, this time against Jason Almond bowling on his home lanes at Leeds. Neil timed his effort to perfection to take the title by 3 pins and bring the trophy back to Bexleyheath. This is a new competition and this trophy has been won by a SEBA bowler for the three years of the event, Rob Hobart from Basildon winning in 1984 and Nick Mullins from Bexleyheath last year.

In the continuing assessment of Junior Bowlers being considered for the Great Britain Junior Squad, Robert Petherick bowled for England against Scotland at Glenrothes in the Summer and Neil Webb went on the trip to Vlaardingen in Holland during October.
