Success for SEBA Bowlers in BTBA National Championships

The BTBA National Championships this year were held in Cardiff in March. The Tournament was classified into Divisions by average and the lower Division of the Men's Doubles was won by Neil Webb and Nick Mullins from Bexleyheath with a magnificent score of 1264, which was a far better score than that recorded

in the higher Division.

Neil Webb went on to win the All-Events in Division B with a nine game total of 1807 to average 200.7 with Nick Mullins taking fourth spot on 1754 (ave. 194.8). Alpha Omega 2, which had both Neil and Nick in their team, finished in second place in the Team Event (Division B).

SEBA Junior Championships — 1989

A total of 161 Junior Bowlers from 5 Centres competed in this year's SEBA Junior Championships at Southend in early May. The youngsters from Bexleyheath travelled by double decker bus to Southend, and were involved in an accident on the way when the front window of the upper deck shattered showering glass into the bus causing some nasty cuts to some of the Juniors and generally skaing everybody up. After a trip to hospital, all was well and everyone of the youngsters bowled in the Tournament, with bandages and plasters proudly displayed. Meanwhile back at Southend, rapid re-squadding was carried out by John Cudmore and Chris Lodge which kept the tournament running almost on time and causing the minimum of delay to the first squads of the Area Championships which started on the same evening.

As usual, the Junior Tournament was a singles competition divided into Classified Divisions on entering averages, coupled with an overall team competition worked out from the finishing positions in the Singles Events.

All-Time Record for Bexleyheath Bowlers in Junior Nationals

Congratulations to Stephen Murr and Richard Prestidge from Bexleyheath on winning the Senior Boys Doubles Title (15 and 16 year olds) at the NAYBC Junior Nationals held at Airport Bowl in May. Not only did they win, but they broke the all-time Tournament Record with a scratch score of 1133, Stephen rolling a 628 series and Richard a 505. Stephen Murr also finished second in the All-Events with a total of 1601 pins over 9 games to average 177.8.

Other successes from SEBA in these Championships were:

Alison Freeman and Cindy Cook from Dagenham won the Graduate Girls Doubles Gold Medal and Alison finished third in the Graduate Girls

All-Events with a total of 1486 (average 165.1).

Clare Newton from Southend won the Junior 2 Girls Singles with a 492 series, the Girls Doubles in partnership with Alison Almond, and not surprisingly took the All-Events title with a score of 1515 (ave. 168.3).

This year was the largest Junior Tournament to have been held in this Country in recent years with a total entry of 1052 youngsters in the Singles events, and a total of 168 five-person Teams in the prestigious Team Event.

During the Closing Ceremony, Alison Freeman was awarded the highly prized Trophy as Junior Girl Bowler of the Year. Many congratulations to you Alison.

1989 SEBA Ladies Masters

The 1989 SEBA Ladies' Masters was held at Southend during the Area Championships. This year 16 Ladies were invited to compete, with each competitor bowling 5 games with bonus points being awarded on the 'BT' system, i.e. 5 extra pins being added on each game for every other bowler's score beaten in that game. The 16 competitors were:—

Rosemary Bentley, Jan Cormack, Marion Drury, Sally Fuller, Deborah Gross, Debbie Heffer, Elaine Hinch, Jan Hodge, Chris Lodge, Ruth Molineaux, Shirley Molineaux, Joan Nutt, Lynn Purcell, Lesley Pope, Sandy Sawyer and Sheila White

Sheila White opened with a 205 game to take the lead with a 75 pin bonus from Jan Cormack who bowled a 194 and Chris Lodge 192. Sheila White was again the only lady to bowl a 200 game with a 203 and extended her lead from the same bowlers although Chris Lodge moved into second place. In Game 3, Deborah Gross (200), Jan Hodge (202) and Lesley Pope (202) raised their game but Sheila White rolled her third 200 game with a 218 to extend her lead over the second placed bowler, Lesley Pope to 117 pins including bonuses. Rosemary Bentley then hit the high game of the Tournament with a 236 to climb into second place on Game 4 leaving Lesley Pope in third place and Sheila well clear in the lead. The final game saw only two high scores with a 212 from Sandy Sawyer and a 207 from Rosemary Bentley to leave her in second place. Chris Lodge finished in third place, but the winner and SEBA Master for the third consecutive year was Sheila White with a scratch score over the five games of 965 (ave. 193.0).

Men's Masters

The Men's Masters followed using the same format, the bowlers invited being:

Keith Boyden, Pete Butcher, Steve Carnall, Bob Doe, Mike Fields, Roy Fillier, Roland Foxley, Robin Garton, Brian Greene, Terry Hewitt, Keith Hodge, John Mills, Clive Mitchell, Roy Myhill, David Wain and Laurie Walmsley

Defending Master, Pete Butcher opened with a 213 game to share the lead with David Wain after game 1 with Keith Hodge in third place following a 211 game. Roy Myhill then rolled a 233 game to move into the lead from Keith Hodge (210) and Steve Carnall (210). Scoring was not high and after Game 3, Keith Hodge had moved into the lead, with David Wain scoring 205 to take second place and Roy dropping back to third. In Game 4, Brian Greene made a challenge rolling a 214 game to overhaul David Wain into second place, but consistent bowling from Keith Hodge kept him in the lead with a slender margin of 25, including bonuses. The last game developed into a straightforward match between the leading two and although Brian Greene had the higher game of 214, Keith Hodge stayed close with a 211 to take him to the title of 1989 SEBA Men's Master Champion.

Keith scored 1022 scratch (ave. 204.5).

The Kent Ladies left themselves too much to do in the second round at Airport after winning only one of their seven games on their home ground at

Bexleyheath. Despite winning all seven games at Airport, they finished in third place and just missed qualifying for the Finals.

Essex v Kent Inter-County Challenge

For the first time for several years, Kent won the Annual Inter-County Challenge match held at Bexleyheath in early June. The match was played over 3 games, each side having 12 ladies and 12 men, with use of substitutes. At the end of game 1, only 4 pins separated each County and at the end of the second game, Essex had moved into a slight lead.

Junior Jottings

The honour of hosting the first Tournament to be held in the new Bexleyheath Superbowl fell to Bexleyheath YBC in early December.

Following last year's success at Lewisham, they staged the 'Coach and Four' Tournament, where one BTBA Instructor bowled with four Juniors in a Handicap Event, on December 10th. The Tournament attracted an entry of 76 Teams from 15 Centres and we were very pleased to welcome Teams from Manchester and Sunderland who spent many hours travelling in order to take part.

The first squad at 9.15 a.m. was filled by the teams from the South being Bexleyheath, Dagenham, Cliftonville, Crawley and Lewisham. The first leaders on the Board were the local Team from Bexleyheath led by Alan Petherick, who were to be shown as leaders for most of the day, although this was due to an addition error on the tally sheet which eluded the Auditors until late in the day. Nevertheless, they were the actual leaders with a score of 2726, the youngsters in the Team being Keith

Willis, Kenneth Brazier (who beat his Instructor), Jeffrey White and Chris Parker.

The new Superbowl has synthetic lanes, and it was fascinating to watch the different reactions from all the bowlers, particularly those who had obviously never bowled on 'synthetics' before. Our experience so far, is that the lanes are very accurate, and even with the heavy pins used, should lead to higher average scores. Accuracy is the key word and a ball slightly off line can be heavily punished.

Bowlers in the second squad came from teams entered by Peterborough, Stevenage, Southend and Portsmouth, but the lead remained unaltered despite a high series of 619 from the Peterborough Instructor, Simon Brown. However, in the next squad, the eventual winners emerged with Brenda Gill leading Peterborough Likely Lot to a total of 2774, with four 16 year old lads in her team, Ian Runacres, Robert Hearn, Greg Hooper and Mark Skippens who bowled his personal best high series of 611 with games of 213, 202 and 196. A few lanes away, Simon Brown was reminding his

Juniors what can be done with games of 193, 225 and 213 for a 631 series.

The third squad introduced Great Yarmouth, Sunderland, Harrow and Starchley but this had no effect on the leader board. Airport YBC had entered 8 Teams in the final squad and came through to fill three places out of the top seven, but Airport 1 fell agonisingly 13 pins short of the leaders to take second place with the team of Richard Harries (Instructor), Paul Edser, Jon Bulmer, Michael Hutchings and Darren Howell, the last two beating their Instructor.

The appeal of the Tournament is the opportunity for the Juniors to play with and possibly beat their Instructors. This year, taking the scratch scores 34 Juniors out of a possible 304 achieved this feat.

The team to finish in third place also came from the last squad, being the local team led by Christine Lodge (Instructor) with Paul Small, Steven Dodd, Darren Bartlett and Stephen Murr. Again the last two beat their Instructor.
