Family rivalry became the main theme, some good bowling took place on testing conditions. Several of the county's junior bowlers took part and were able to show their elders a thing or two.

The opening squad saw local bowlers Jean and Trevor Myhill go into an early lead, albeit by only one pin in front of Bexleyheath juniors Joanne and Edward Shrimpton. Does the name sound familiar? They are two of our President's children and they were definitely out to prove something to Ted.

Squad two saw a couple of good scratch scores go in especially from Lesley Pope and Steve Carnall who shot 1080, this Bexleyheath pairing also took the lead in the handicap section.

The Shrimptons were back in action in the next squad, this time the "old fella" Ted and his other daughter, Mandi. 1268 put them into the lead in the handicap section.

Squad four saw Whitstable's Sue Trott and Ken Barnard put in a challenge for the scratch title, falling just short at 1068. The most spectacular individual scoring came in the next squad. The top men's series of the day was rolled by Peter Baldwin with games of 220, 223, 190 for a fine 633. Peter bowls at Cliftonville these days but originally played at Bexleyheath. In the team opposing Peter was Doreen Lodge who took the ladies' high series of the day with 593. When Doreen started her second game with seven strikes in a row Mandi and Ted were looking worried but despite her 259 game Doreen and her partner, Alan Mills, could not quite get enough pins, nor could Peter and his wife Lynn.

Squad six saw another strong challenge to the leaders from a Cliftonville pairing, Sally Fuller and Chris Smith. 584 from Chris and Sally's 538, gave them the scratch title but they were just short of the handicap total. Congratulations to Sally and Chris who I understand will be challenging for places in the Kent County squad this year.

Ted and Mandi were beginning to think that they were meant to win but they reckoned without younger sister Joanne. Jo had been scratching around for a partner for the last re-entry squad and finally dug out "Uncle John", better known to you and me as John Cudmore former SEBA Area Secretary.

John had had a busy day as usual at a tournament and was just out for a pleasant "chuck", but realising after two games that Joanne was sixty pins over her average and they were in with a chance pulled out a 225 game. 16 year old Joanne had bowled her way to her personal best series of 527 and they had taken the title by 23 pins. Ted was first to congratulate this year's winners of the Bert and Vicky Timms Memorial Mixed Doubles, and the good news is that a fortnight later Mandi started talking to Joanne again.

Congratulations once again to all our winners and a big thank you to Terry Randall and his staff at Whitstable for their hard work and warm welcome.

Will Clarke's two sons filled in, Tony with a 150 average and Dean with a 160 average. In the last game Tony really hit form hitting a 222 backed up by Kevin Raison (201), Steve White (227), Alan Hutchins (228) and Dean Clarke (144) giving the team a last game of 1022. With their proud achievement they went home and showed dad. Not to be outdone, two months later the Mean Machine hit 1029 this time with Will bowling. At the end of January a grudge match was fought between Mean Machine and Glaze Rite. The scoring was high on both sides with very close matches. In the first game Mean Machine opened up with a 959 but Glaze Rite had a 989, the second game Mean Machine hit 958 to 937. In the third game it was nip and tuck all the way with Mean Machine making 949 but Glaze Rite hit 984. Mean Machine made 2866 and Glaze Rite 2900. On the next lane junior bowler Steve Dodd hit 606 followed the next week by a 618, his third 600 of the season.

CLIFTONVILLE

For the third year in succession Mike Luckhurst carried off the tenpin title in the men's division I section of the Bowler of the Year Tournament at Cliftonville's Top Ten Centre.

He had a total pinfall of 1181 comprising games of 222, 184, 181, 216, 191 and 187 for a 196 average. Only 18 pins behind him on 1163 was John Boulton with tallies of 189, 222, 168, 203, 188 and 193, in third place was Matt Slade with 1110 total, Matt bowled the Tournament high game of 244. Competition in this division was very fierce with Mike leading in the first round, John in the second and Chris Smith in the third, in the end, though, all the bowlers had to give way to Mike who tenaciously held on to his title.

The Kent Roll-Off is this year being held on 6th, 7th and 14th April at Cliftonville. Winner of the ladies' division I section was Jill Houston whose games of 197, 172, 221, 181, 189 and 141 gave her an overall total of 1101 for an average of 183. She was in front from start to finish despite facing a tough challenge from runner-up Sally Fuller (1036) and third-placed Marion Constable (1004).

In the men's division II section a new face on the tenpin scene, Steve Milham snapped up the trophy, he had scores of 179, 201, 157, 173, 226 and 214 for a 1150 total. Runner-up was Mick Lewis with 1055 while Pete Baldwin and Stephen Alexander were joint third with 1034.

The ladies' division II title this year went to Barbara Endicott who is another newcomer to tenpin bowling, she bowled really we'll and with a pinfall of 1032 had a 172 average. Second was Astrid Allen with 934 and Julie Whittall third, one pin behind.

Winner of the men's division III was Kevin Miles with 1089 while Brett Lawson (1026 was second and Kevin Stocker (994) was third. This was a fine display by Miles who has only been bowling for a year and also Brett who is a YBC bowler.

The trophies this year were donated and presented by Mr Alan Weston, Managing Director of Top Ten Bowling for whose support the bowlers are grateful.

29th Area Championships

The 29th Annual K.T.B.A. (formerly S.E.B.A.) Area Championships will take place at Bexleyheath Super Bowl on 11th, 12th and 19th May 1991. Entry is open to all bona fide members of the B.T.B.A. who joined for the current season through K.T.B.A. or to direct members within the county boundaries of Kent.

What is the KTBA 200, 500, 550 & 600 Club?

As you can see from our Tournament Calendar the 200, 500, 550 and 600 Tournament for 1990 Club members takes place at Hollywood Bowl, Margate on Sunday 24th March and Christine Lodge, the Tournament Manager, informs me that entries are coming in thick and fast.

If you do not know what this club is all about then I will try to explain.

Years ago there was a need for a Tournament for the not so good bowlers who would not have to compete against their betters but against their equals but demanded some qualification and standards of entry. The Tournament Sub Committee of the then Area Association came up with the idea of a tournament for all the lower average bowlers who had bowled a 200 game during the year. So the 200 Club was started.

From there it progressed to the 500 Club for ladies, the 550 Club for the slightly better bowlers and the 600 club for the scratch players. There are plans to introduce a 175 Club for Juniors depending upon the reaction we get from junior leagues.

To be eligible for membership to one of these CLUBS you must have bowled at least a 200 game for the 200 CLUB, 500 series for the 500 CLUB, 550 series for the 550 CLUB and 600 series for the 600 CLUB and meet the qualifications shown below.

200 CLUB is for anyone with an average of 159 and under.

What is K.T.B.A.?

The KENT TENPIN BOWLING ASSOCIATION is affiliated to the B.T.B.A. and covers the bowling centres in the county of Kent. Every bowler who joins the B.T.B.A. through a sanctioned league automatically becomes a K.T.B.A. member.

K.T.B.A. has elected Council Officers who are bowlers and who act in their spare time as local representatives and link the bowler on the lanes with the Area Council, the Area Secretary and finally the General Secretary of the B.T.B.A.

The objects of our K.T.B.A. local association throughout the are to:

- a. Increase the number of members through strengthening leagues and helping to organise new ones.
- b. Improve and increase the services to members.
- c. Help to train officials in the operation of leagues and tournaments.
- d. To organise and distribute all materials necessary for the efficient operation and sanction of leagues with the B.T.B.A.

- e. Hold four Council meetings each year and a K.T.B.A. Annual General Meeting for league delegates to participate in the decision making process. Provide delegates each year for the B.T.B.A. Annual General Meeting and to propose for election a delegate to the National Council of the B.T.B.A. to represent Kent.
- f. To organise and run tournaments for our members including our Area Championships, Club Championships, Mixed Doubles Championships and any other that may be required.
- g. Provide a direct means of communication through Bowling News and to give advice and guidance on the rules and regulations of our sport.
- h. Set up investigation committees when complaints of rule breakages occur.
- j. Work with other organisations in the Bowling and Sporting world for our mutual benefit and to improve communications between all parties.
