Is Yours a S L O W League?

Does the league that follows yours always have to start late? Does the centre manager complain that yours is the Tortoise League?

You should do something about it Mr. Secretary. Do you start on time?

start on time. One tardy player can upset a complete evening's league scheduling. Are any of your bowlers chatting with players from other teams and wander about the councourse when it's their turn to bowl? Do they show excessive courtesy to players four or five lanes on either side of them? Do they spend ages wiping their bowling ball with their towel when there is nothing left to wipe off or are they found having a

drink or playing the machines?

Here are five points that should be stressed to every member of your league:—

- Be ready to bowl when the pins
 are up.
- Give right of way to bowlers already on the approach but be ready to pick up your bowl and take position without delay.
- 3) When waiting for your ball to come back stand back off the approach to allow others to take their shot.
- 4) Give precedence to the bowler on the right unless he has a full deck of pins and you are shooting for a spare.
- 5) Minimise aiming on the approach.

It was great to see one of the old stagers come good," with Ron Dwyer, who is currently averaging 149, come up with a 248 game.


