1302 Mixed Doubles Record

Chris Lodge and Neil Webb win K.T.B.A. Masters

The K.T.B.A. MASTERS CHAM-PIONSHIPS is our premier event in our Area Championships and entry is by invitation only. Those invited were the top average bowlers from our Area Champiosnhips entry plus, from the men the winner of our 600 Club and the ladies the top scratch score from the 500 Club.

Those invited for 1991 were, for the ladies, Rosemary Bentley from Whistable, Sally Fuller from Ciifton-ville/Margate. Elaine Hinch, Jan Hodge, Christine Lodge and Sheila White all from Bexleyheath. The men were David Yoxall from Whitstable, Mike Luckhurst from Cliftonville/Margate, Roland Foxley, Keith Hodge, John Amos and Neil Webb all from Bexleyheath.

The format is a round robin singles tournament with the winner of each game receiving 30 bonus pins. After the five games against each of their opponents there was a final "position" round. The 1991 Master would be the bowler with the highest pinfall after the six games.

Game one of the Ladies Masters saw Sheila White defeat Jan Hodge 231/210, Chris Lodge defeat Elaine Hinch 224/171 and Rosemary Bentley beat Sally Fuller 163/132. In game two there were wins for Rosemary Bentley over Chris Lodge 143/124, Jan Hodge over Sally Fuller 175/162 and Sheila White over Elaine Hinch 189/157. For the third game Elaine defeated Jan 192/137 (at this point Jan Hodge had to withdraw through injury, her place being taken by a pacer), Sheila defeated Rosemary 192/171

and Chris beat Sally 193/163.

After three games the positions were 1st Sheila White, having won all three games, with 612 plus 90 for 702, 2nd was Chris Lodge, who won two of her games, with 541 plus 60 for 601.

Game four saw Sheila White suffer her first defeat to Sally Fuller 178/148, while Chris Lodge defeated Poppy Cope (our pacer) 216/169 and in the other game Elaine Hinch defeated Rosemary Bentley 162/133. With Chris's 68 pin advantage over Sheila's game plus 30 for her win, brought her to within 3 pins of Sheila's total.

In game five Sheila played Christine and after a close game saw Chris the winner by just 12 pins, 182/170 this with her bonus of 30 put Chris into the lead by 39 with 1059 to Sheila second on 1020. Third was Elaine Hinch with 962, fourth Rosemary Bentley and fifth Sally Fuller.

In the last game, the position round, Sheila was again to play Christine and to win our masters Sheila knew she must not only beat Chris but do so by 10 pins. Sheila managed the win but alas by only 4 pins 176/172 which made Christine Lodge our 1991 Ladies Master Champion by just 5 pins from Sheila White in second placed. Elaine Hinch was third, Sally Fuller fourth and Rosemary Bentley fifth.

Game one of the Men's Masters saw John Amos defeat Roland Foxley 192/161. Neil Webb defeated Keith Hodge 184/170 and Mike Luckhurst beat David Yoxall (see page 2)

210/185. In game two there were wins for Neil Webb over Mike Luckhurst 230/173, Roland Foxley over David Yoxall 176/148 and Keith Hodge over John Amos 226/174. For the third game Keith defeated Roland 232/211, John defeated Mike 177/168 and Neil beat David 211/156.

After three games the positions were 1st Neil Webb who had won all three of his games, with 625 plus 90 for 715, 2nd was Keith Hodge, with two wins and 628 plus 60 for 688, third also with two wins was John Amos with 543 plus 60 for

Game four saw a fourth win for Neil against Roland 177/155, and third wins for Keith over Mike 195/191 and John over David 186/173. With the higher game Keith had closed the gap to only 7 pins with John 94 pins adrift.

In game five, Neil Webb captured his fifth win in a row, this time over

John Amos 191/177 so making it virtually impossible with only one game to go for John to close the gap between them. Neil's closest rival, Keith Hodge, could only get a 165 draw against David Yoxall so falling 50 pins behind. In the other game Roland Foxley beat Mike Luckhurst 183/160.

Game six, the position round, saw Neil Webb play Keith Hodge, Keith knew he had to win by 21 pins to become our Master Champion. But it was not to be. Neil Webb bowled 204 to Keith's 181 so becoming our 1991 Masters Cham-

After all the scores had been checked and double checked the K.T.B.A. President, Ted Shrimpton, offered his congratulations and presented the Master Trophies to our champions. There is no entry free for our Masters hence no prize money just the honour of becoming the K.T.B.A. Masters Champion of 1991 and that honour goes to CHRISTINE LODGE and NEIL WEBB.

James Pateman, from Bexleyheath Y.B.C., who is 9 years old on 1st June 1991, came home from this year's NAYBC Junior National Championships with two Gold Medals won in the Peewee Division. Firstly, he won the Singles Event with a new NAYBC Record Score of 423 and then went on through the Doubles and Team Events to win the "All, Events' Title.

This year was the 25th Silver Jubilee Championships held at Tottenham, which attracted a record entry of 1454 (yes one thousand. four hundred and fifty four) Junior Bowlers.

Although no other medals came back to Bexleyheath, there were some excellent individual performances, which we will detail in the next issue of "Bowling News".

The format was the same as the previous SEBA Junior Champion ships, being a Scratch Singles Event classified into six Divisions by entering average.

A total of 77 Bowlers entered from Bexleyheath, Cliftonville and Whitstable. The lower average bowlers rolled a three game series and the higher average bowled a six game series.

We hear that Margate are forming a Y.B.C. and look forward to a four centre competition next year.

K.T.B.A. Area Championships — 1991

Our 1991 Area Championships were held on the 11th, 12th and 19th May at Bexleyheath Super Bowl. The entry was a little under the capacity of the tournament with 36 teams, 88 doubles and 163 singles, but with an 8.00 p.m. finish to each day, for us running our Areas it was a most civilised event, for gone were the late night finishes and us getting home in the early hours of the next day.

The first singles squad has in the past few years gained somewhat of a tradition for providing us with the winner of the Regular Division, this year was no exception with Alan Kirk rolling games of 181, 225, 258 for a fine 664 series, with his handicap of 50 Alan captured both the Handicap and Scratch Singles titles. On the same first squad Eric White rolled a 579 series plus 107 for 686, David Wain 606 plus 57 and Barry Denne 533 plus 133 both for 663 to fill 2nd and 3rd places in the handicap section. David Wain's 606 put him into second place in the scratch section.

It wasn't until the last squad of the first weekend that these handicap scores were beaten. 14 year old David Mills who only has a 127 average bowled his first ever 200 game in his 499 series and with his 174 handicap made 673 to put him into third place and Brian Godden bowled 584 plus 84 for 668 and fourth place in the Regular Handicap Singles at that time.

The second Sunday started with Alan Jones bowling a 611 series plus 76 handicap for 687, this put Alan 2nd in both the scratch and handicap sections. The scratch score would stand but in the very last singles squad he was pushed down to fourth place by two members of the Valiants team squad, Chris White with games of 161, 201, 245 for 607 scratch plus 88 handicap for 696 and second place, and, Kevin Hollyhock with games of 245, 178, 147 for 570 plus 120 giving him 690 and third place. In the same squad Keith Shafto made a steady 608 series which would be good enough for 3rd place in the Scratch section but with his 76 handicap could only make 7th in the Handicap section on 684.

In the Ladies' Singles Emma Drury bowling in only the second singles squad had games of 180, 182, 220 for a 582 scratch series and with an added 118 a 700 handicap series. These would be good enough for both Ladies Singles Titles

Fine efforts were made to catch Emma by the ladies in the first squad on the next morning with Jeanette Bartram 506 plus 164 handicap for 670 and second place, Mandi Shrimpton 518 plus 145 for 663 and third place, Elaine Hinch 564 plus 76 for 640 and fourth place and the Tournament Manager, Christine Lodge, with 563 plus 61 for 624 and fifth place at the time.

Elaine's 564 and Christine's 563 would be good enough for 2nd and 3rd places in the Ladies Scratch Singles section and was only threatened by Jan Hodge with a 561. Christine's fifth place in the handicap section was to be beaten by Pat Overy, 512 plus 118 for 630 and then by Sue Trott, 546 plus 86 for 632. Very close for the ladies' placings.

The leaders after the first day in both sections of the Regular Doubles were Fred Spears and Brian Dodd with 1116 scratch and 1259 handicap. These scores were to survive until midway through the next day when Steve White had games of 179, 188, 211 for 578 series and Alan Hutchings 225, 215, 206 for a 646 which combined gave them a scratch total of 1224 and plus their combined handicap of 113 a handicap total of 1337. On the last squad of that day John and Ivan Amos bowled 1148 scratch plus 118 for 1266 handicap total and second place at the time.

On the last day, in the handicap section, John and Ivan were first to be beaten by Adrian Conner and Carl Bradbury with 1053 plus 233 for 1286 and they in turn were beaten in the very last doubles squad by Neil Webb and Nick Mullins with 1193 plus 97 for 1290, but neither pairing were able to catch Steve White and Alan Hutchins who are our 1991 Regular Doubles Champions in both the Scratch and Handicap sections.

In the Ladies' Handicap Doubles,

Melissa Browning and Rosemary Bentley bowled 1036 plus 198 for 1234 and Sue Crowhurst and Alison Keenan 889 plus 332 for 1221 putting them in first and second place after the first day. The second day started with Mandi and Joanne Shrimpton going into the lead with 962 plus 290 and Doreen Lodge and Angie Thick with 1003 plus 211 for 1214 for fourth place.

Mandi Shrimpton has been second in the last two K.T.B.A. tournaments, was she at last to become a K.T.B.A. champion? Alas no, they were to be beaten in the very last squad by Gill Cook and Jan Luckhurst who bowled games of 192, 166, 167, 165, 161, 198 for 1094 plus 242 for a very good 1291 and the Ladies' Handicap Doubles Title. In the same last squad Gaenor and Jill Houston rolled 999 plus 216 for 1215 and fifth place.

In the Ladies' Scratch Doubles Elaine Hinch and Christine Lodge were first to be put on the score board with 1018 only to be beaten in the very next doubles squad by Jan Hodge and Sheila White who had games of 182, 174, 165, 170, 200, 302 for 1094 so retaining their Ladies' Scratch Doubles Title. Carol House and Lita Andrews were third with 1016.

In the Team Event we had one squad on each of the three days of our Area Championships, the first being on the Saturday evening where we saw the Whitstable Raider take the lead in the Regular Handicap section with 3053 followed by The Fireball Five with 3014. In the same squad, The Fireball Ladies took the lead in the Ladies' Handicap section with 2868.

The second team squad was to provide winners of three of the four team titles. In the Ladies' Handicap, Iffy Sox Squad Right (Sandy Knapp, Angie Thick, Jeanette Bartram, Elaine Hinch and Christine Lodge) bowled 2420 scratch plus their handicap of 541 for 2961 and first place while Tutti Frutti (Penny Allsop, Lita Andrews, Julie Giles, Jan Hodge and Sheila White) bowled 2500 scratch but only had 412 handicap for 2912 and second place. These placings were only to be challenged in the last squad by

The Hollywood Girls who bowled a handicap total of 2813 to take fourth place.

The first two places in the Ladies' Handicap Team were to be reversed in the Ladies' Scratch Team event with Tutti Frutti taking first place with Iffy Sox Squad Left taking second. Both of these Ladies Team Champions had successfully retained the titles they won in our 1990 Area Championships.

In the Regular Handicap Team event, the second squad saw Ozone Friendly go into fifth place with 2999, their 2712 scratch was to place them first on the score board in the Regular Scratch Team event. Fred and Flintstones were second with 3041 but the lead was to be taken by Alpha Omega (Ted Shrimpton, John Darby, Jerry Lodge, John Cudmore and Alan Terry) with 3170. Alpha Omega last won the Handicap Team Title in 1975, three of their 1975 team bowled in this year's Areas, their score in 1975 was 3172, are they going down hill?

The last team squad saw The Highwaymen bowl 3093 for second place in the Handicap Team event. The Valliants II third with 3071, Woolwich Cubs fifth with 3053 and Woolwich seventh with 3022. The Highwaymen's scratch total of 2736

was to give them second place in the Scratch Team as well but Woolwich (Keith Knott, Terry Miller, Rod Wickens, Moss Ryder and Paul Lakey) were to take the Scratch Team Title with 2743.

In the All Events section, which is the total of the player's scores from his Single, Doubles and Team, Kevin Hollyhock won the Regular Handicap with 1956 with Fred Spears second on 1952, Keith Shafto third with 1941 and Brian Godden fourth on 1926. The Regular Scratch saw Chas Painter first with 1746, Alan Kirk second with 1743 and Cliff Dew third with 1742.

In the Ladies' Handicap, Mandi Shrimpton at last won a title with 1888 with Sue Crowhurst second with 1880 and Elaine Hinch third with 1877. For the Ladies' Scratch All Events, Christine Lodge was first with 1652, Elaine Hinch second on 1649 and Rosemary Bentley and Jan Hodge tying for third place with 1622.

Lastly, I must thank, on behalf of all those who took part in our Area Championships, Brian Langford and his staff at Bexleyheath Bowl for making us most welcome and our Tournament Manager, Christine Lodge and all her band of helpers for another enjoyable and well run K.T.B.A. Tournament.
