

F.I.Q. World Championships

The 12th F.I.Q. World Championships took place at the lavishly marbled 32 lane Singapore Superbowl between the 21st and 31st August 1991. The Great Britain Team were Kimberley Coote, Lynne Giles, Diane Joyce, Shelagh Leonard, Alison Teasdale and Georgina Wardel for the ladies, and Andrew Bennett, Simon Brown, Lawrence Ellis, Ronald Oldfield, Neil Walker and Brian Williams for the men's team.

The Masters Gold Medal was won by Finland's Mika Koivuniemi who defeated his team mate, Teemu Raatikainen, in the two game championship roll off 436-405. Koivuniemi qualified second in the round-robin semi finals, he earned his shot at the title by defeating Sweden's Tomas Leandersson 236-188, in the third place match.

Catherine Willis from Canada qualified in first place from the play offs and defeated Lisa Kwan from Malaysia 420-382, in the two game championship roll off to capture the Women's Masters title. Lisa Kwan, who had qualified in third place had previously defeated Maria Ortiz from Puerto Rico, 206-167.

The Masters finals were the climax of a 10 day bowling extravaganza which saw 496 bowlers for 49 countries attempt to win medals in the 12 categories.

The leading Gold Medal winner was Ying Chieh Ma from Taiwan, who won or shared titles in the men's singles, team and all events. He averaged 221 in the singles and 210 in the all events.

Canada's women had never before won a medal at any World Championships but this time they came away with four. In addition to her Masters medal, Catherine Willis was second in the all events, teamed with Jane Amlinger for second in the doubles and helped Canada win the women's trios.

The FIQ, bowling's world governing body, conducts its Championships every four years. The 13th FIQ World Championships will be held in Reno, Nevada in 1995.
