VAN DEN BOSCH NOW REIGNS IN IRELAND, TOO

Britain's Pauline Smith and Marcel Van den Bosch of the Netherlands are the new AIB Irish Open Champions, after surviving thrilling stepladder showpiece finals at Stillorgan Bowl in Dublin.

Success was particularly sweet for Pauline Smith. In the inaugural Open she finished third; she moved up to a second place finish in 1991. She finally made the winners podium this year topping Ireland's Yvonne Randall and Holland's Farida Pascoal before defeating fellow Britain and top seed, Kimberley Coote in the stepladder final, 200 - 194. The win was a particularly handsome consolation for Pauline, who lost out to Sweden's Asa Larsson in the AMF Bowling Would Cup in Beijing just three months before.

There are also heady days for the precocious 20 year old Van den Bosch. The lefty lifted the prestigious British Open last September, then went on to claim the 1991 Greek Open.

In fact the men's finals were very much a Dutch treat. In the opener, the seasoned international veteran Eric Kok disposed of Margate's Cliff Dew, 216 - 181, before going down, 234 - 214, in a showstopper against Marco Maaswinkel. The all Dutch championship shoot out finished up in Van den Bosch's favour, 230 - 196.

Once again the IR10,000 event was sponsored by AIB Bank and held at Stillorgan Bowl in Dublin.
