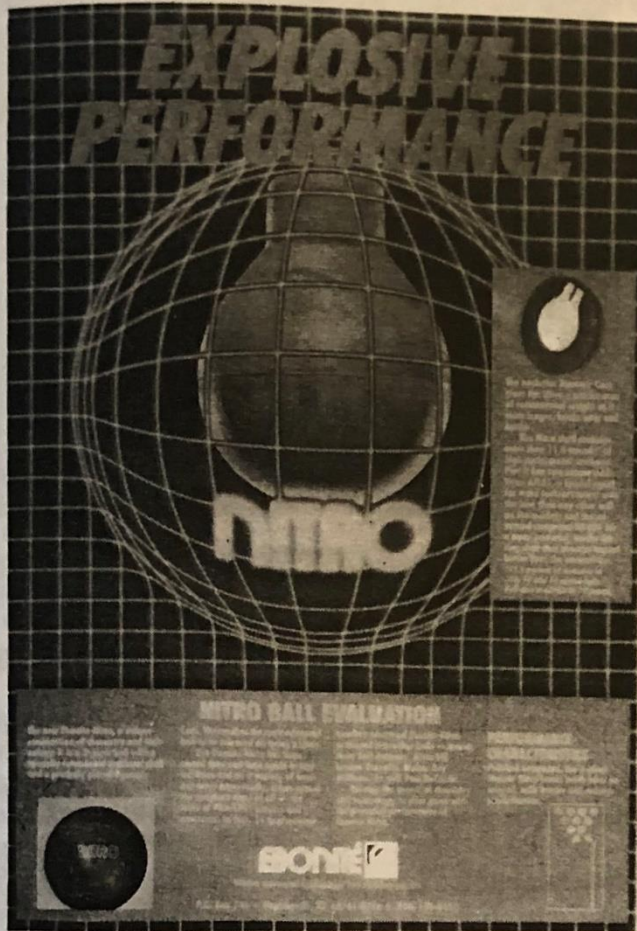

John's RAF career was in administration and during 28 years of bowling has always been involved in bowling administration fulfilling one position or another. Most enjoyable point being the SEBA bowling tour to America.

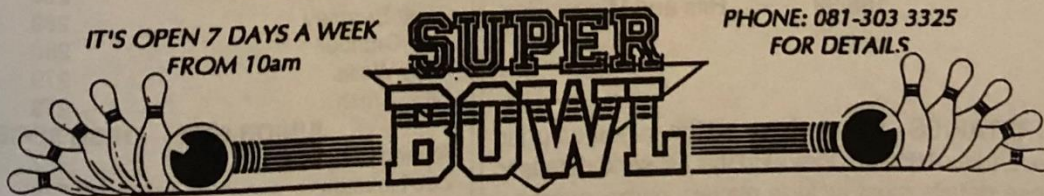
