Each year at this Tournament a trophy is presented to the Lady having the highest entering Average and for 1993 the trophy went to Doreen Lodge, with a 180 average from the Tuesday League.

TOP TEN BOWLS HIGH AVERAGE TOURNAMENT

Cliftonville's Top Ten Bowl High Average Invitational Tournament this year really lived up to its high expectations. The top twelve highest average bowlers competed for the title of champion by each bowling 6 games spread over 6 different pairs of lanes, a real test of a bowler's ability.

Game one had 4 bowlers exceeding 200 but John Smith's 212 was the highest. Game two and 8 bowlers pass 200, Matt Slade the best with a 235 closely followed by Gary Steventon 231, Chris Smith 222 gave him a 432 and put him in the lead. Game three has Chris Rice in with a 219 and 603 total, a total also equalled by Mike Luckhurst. On 615 is Gary Steventon, Matt Slade rolls a 215 and totals 623 but Chris Smith puts in a 229 and 661 series, really fine consistent bowling and still in the lead.

Game four and Chris Smith rolls a 203 for 864 total still bowling well and still in the lead. Gary follows on 817 and John Smith on 806. Game five and Chris falters badly with a 162, only John Smith can manage to take advantage he rolls his best game yet a 234 and with it the lead by 14 pins over Chris, John's total is 1040.

The final game and still the tournament is wide open, Clive Smith has bowled consistently well though never really sparkling, his 1189 total puts him in 3rd place. John Smith rolled a final game of 201 and his 1241 total gives him a 207 average and 2nd place. Chris Smith has saved his best until the last a 236 game and 1262 total, his average of 210 over the six games establishes him as this years Hi Average Invitational Champion. The tournament had 29 of the 72 games in excess of 200 and the tournament average was 189, truly splendid.

MICK CHAPMAN


It is with much personal regret that I must announce the sudden death of Mick Chapman of Top Ten Bowl, Cliftonville, who passed away after a heart attack.

In April 1994 a Memorial Tournament will be held in memory of Mick and it is hoped that all who knew him will participate.




