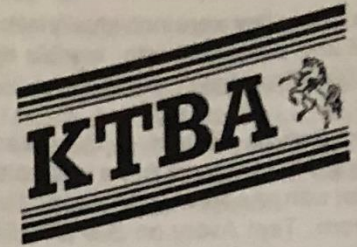

KENT MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS JAN HODGE BECOMES LADIES MASTERS CHAMPION AND DAVE WAIN RETAINS HIS TITLE

The Masters Competition was held during our Area Championships at Cliftonville in May.

The Ten Men and Ladies invited to compete for the Masters Titles, having qualified by their positions in last years Championships, winning various KTBA competitions or invited from this years entry to our Championships, were, for the mens title:-

The first step ladder game was between third place finisher Dave Wain (794) and the second placed Chris Smith (807) with the winner to play the leader, Mike Luckhurst (855).

The step ladder finals of both the Mens and Ladies Titles were played at the same time and resulted in excellent competitive bowling, particularly in the final games.

All competitors were presented with commemorative medals by the KTBA president, John Cudmore, as the bowlers were individually introduced on the lanes.

The format of the Competition was a four game qualifying series with the top three bowlers progressing to a Step Ladder Final.

Mike Luckhurst started off in style with a 233 game to lead Chris Smith (244) and John Hinch (212), but Dave Wain struggled on a 136 game. The second game saw Mike Luckhurst retain his lead with a 182 game to open up a gap of 26 pins from Keith Hodge (212 game), a score equalled by Andy Allerton.

After a 215 game, Mike Luckhurst had a three game series of 630 to keep a comfortable lead from Chris Smith (221) but David Wain, with the highest game of 246, advanced from ninth to third place.

The fourth game saw no change in the positions with 200 games from the leaders and also John Smith who finished in fourth place on a total of 782.

Dave Wain had a comfortable win against Chris Smith by 210 to 173, and in the final there was a titanic struggle with Mike Luckhurst putting together a run of strikes following an open frame to compete against steady closed frames from Dave. As it came to the last frame Mike needed a closed frame but left a disastrous split to lose 205/211 so Dave Wain became the 1994 Kent Master, being the first bowler to successfully defend his title in the long history of this event.

KENT AREA JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Again all bowlers were individually introduced and presented with medals by the KTBA President.

With identical format to the Mens Masters, Jan Hodge took the lead from the start with an opening game of 212 to lead from Tam Avery on 206 and Jill Baldwin with 190.

Jan then opened up a formidable lead of 55 pins with a 233 second game from Tam Avery with Jill Baldwin holding third place and Jan Luckhurst fourth.

Five ladies had 200 games in game three and with Jan having a poor game her lead over Tam was reduced to one pin, with Sue Trott moving into third place 51 pins down on the leader and Sally Fuller in fourth place a further 10 pins behind.

Game four saw Jan Hodge scoring another 200 plus game, a 202 to lead the qualifiers with a 793 series, Tam Avery holding on to second place with a 753 series and Sally Fuller in third with 730, a few pins ahead of Jan Luckhurst in fourth place.

The first game in the step ladder final resulted in a clear win for Sally Fuller over Tam Avery by 244 to 184 and another close final where every frame counted in a close struggle with Jan Hodge, who always held the advantage to run out Champion by 211 to 201 to become Kent Ladies Master for the first time, although she had won the title in the old SEBA days.

Both competitions were fought out in an excellent spirit and were well supported by an enthusiastic audience.

**1994 KTBA
MASTERS
CHAMPIONS**

The 1994 Junior Area Championships were held at Bexleyheath Superbowl and attracted an entry of 102 bowlers from our four current YBC's in the County, namely Bexleyheath, Cliftonville, Margate and Whitstable.

This is basically a Singles Event, divided into 6 Divisions by entering average with separate boys and girls sections.

Whitstable Girls dominated Division 1 with Lisa Wraight taking the Gold Medal, Anne Perkins, the Silver and Katie Collins the Bronze.

Division 2 was closely fought with Kate Harrison, also from Whitstable, running out the winner from Haley Patey of Bexleyheath.

Division 3 was a runaway win for Lucy Cudmore (Bexleyheath) averaging 172.5 over her six games.

The local lads performed well in Division 4 with Guyan Pattinson taking the Title, whereas Division 5 turned into a clean sweep for Whitstable, Christopher Hall averaging 169.8 over 6 games.

The most exciting competition of the day was in the top Boy's Division 6 with David Mills (Bexleyheath) setting the standard in the early squads with a 6 game total of 1186 averaging 197.7. However, Grant Machin (Bexleyheath), having just returned from holiday in the States, bowled very consistently to pip David by 10 pins with an excellent average of 197.7.

Over the day, 513 games were bowled in the Singles Event averaging 134.7 per game.

THE 1994 AREA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1994 Championships were held at Cliftonville on three consecutive Sundays in May. As usual, we were made most welcome by Jackie Fenton and her staff and the smells from the snack bar were as appetising as ever.

The highlights on the first day included an opening game of 267 by Jan Hodge in the Ladies Singles with a Scratch Series of 632 and a Handicap total of 716, which were to stand throughout the Tournament to take both titles. In the Scratch Section, Sheila White consolidated second place with a 580 series, Sally Fuller bowled a 572 to take third place. Penny Allsop rolled a 557 (662 handicap) to move into third place in the handicap section.

On the same squad, Dave Yoxall rolled a 255 in his third game for a 621 scratch, 705 handicap series to take the lead in the Regular Singles. This score overtook the leader from the first squad Tony Lock, whose 233 final game gave him a series of 574, 682 with handicap.

In the Men's Doubles, very consistent bowling from Mike Root (206,189,195) and Norman Roud (185,213,211) took them into the lead of the handicap section with 1382 ahead of Gary Steventon and Andy Allerton, both rolling 611 series to lead the Scratch Section. Chris Skudder (660) and Alan Jones (581) moved into second place in the Handicap Division on 1376, but took the lead in the Scratch Section with a total of 1241. Simon Young and Malcolm Fuller rolled 4 games over 200 out of six but could not catch the leaders in either section.

In the Ladies Doubles, Sally Fuller (513) and Sandy Sawyer (633) swept into the lead in both the Handicap (1296) and Scratch (1146).

The last squad on the first day was the Team Event and David Yoxall obviously inspired his team, The Last Resort to great efforts to take the lead in the Handicap Section with the Weston family in good form. Father Frank anchored with a 607 series and 11 year old Nicholas rolled a consistent 453 set to pip Mother Diane (421). Newcomer Jeff Withers in his first Area Championships bowled a 408 series with David

Yoxall on a 535 to give an overall Handicap Total of 3096 to ensure they would be in the final placings. In the Scratch Section, there was the expected battle between the Highwaymen and the Chessmen with the former coming out on top by only 17 pins with a 2634 series.

In the Ladies Event, Tutti Frutti swept into the lead in both sections which they were to hold throughout the Tournament.

The high scoring in the Tournament generally was reflected in the first squad on the second Sunday as Chas Painter rolled games of 181,202 and 227 for a 610 series which was to leave him eventually in seventh place in the Scratch Singles and twelfth in the Handicap. In the following squad, Tom McQuade (607) and Rod Wickens (584), both from the same S.E. Pro Shop team as Chas Painter, bowled very consistently but this only resulted in lower places in the overall results.

Bob Potts bowled a 658 series in the Doubles but with his partner, Chris Smith, failing to hit 500 it counted for nought.

The fireworks really started in the Team Squad as Mean Machine took the Area All-Time Record, which had stood for many years, with a scratch total of 2956 and a handicap score of 3268, thanks to a marvellous set of 728 from Keith Hodge with games of 268,225 & 235. Although none of the other team members hit 600, they all supported Keith well with series of 527 for Steve White, 578 for Alan Hart, 530 for John O'Neill and 593 for Clive Mitchell including a final game of 248.

Keith had obviously taken a liking to the lanes as he rolled games of 214,191 & 223 in his Singles (628) and games of 205,221 & 210 in the Doubles (636) to shatter the Kent All Time All Events Record, which had stood since 1975 in SEBA days with Colin Presland from Southend, with a nine game total of 1992 (game average 221.3). Not surprisingly, his handicap total of 2118 took him into the lead in that section as well.

All this excitement tended to overshadow other large scores going in, which saw Clive Smith moving into first

place in the Mens Singles with games of 227,193 & 268 for a 688 series. On the same lanes, John Smith rolled 185,242 & 215 for a 642 series to take second place in the Scratch Section.

John Smith (580) and Paul Crundell (616) must have thought they bowled quite well, but ended up fifth in the scratch and eleventh in the Handicap Doubles.

On the last Sunday, there were many worried frowns studying the Leader Board before bowling started. Rob Packman tried hard in the Singles with games of 190,204 & 204 to take fourth place in the Handicap Section.

The Cudmore girls, Lucy and Julie, still both Juniors and fresh from their triumph in the BTBA Nationals where they won the Ladies Doubles title in Division "C", moved into fourth spot in the Ladies Handicap Doubles.

The next Singles Squad saw Sheila Stevens bowl a 691 handicap series to move into second spot if the Ladies Event.

Local bowler, Mike Luckhurst opened his challenge on Keith Hodge with a 641 series in the Singles followed by 631 in the Doubles.

Maureen Memmott bowled a 662 handicap (488 scratch) series to take fourth place in the Ladies singles.

To show that all the scores were not out of sight, Malcolm and Eric Frankland bowled a scratch series of 1145 to move into third place in the Handicap Section on 1334.

The final Team Squad featured the Hollywood All Stars in the Ladies Event, who moved into second place in both sections, thanks to a 579 series from Sue Trott.

In the Mens Event, Mike Luckhurst, bowling for Kozmic Crash, added a 658 series, including two 236 games, to his other scores to record an All Events Score of 1930 (game average 214.4) to take second place in the Scratch

Section, just ahead of Clive Smith on 1900 (average 211.1).

The final squads produced no results to affect the main placings.

The high scoring over the three week-ends is reflected in the Tournament Statistics. With 191 Bowlers participating, the Tournament Average was 166.2 per game, the total pinfall being 233100 over 1402 games, there being 173 games of 200+ (i.e. 1 in 8 games approximately) and 27 series of 600+ (i.e. 1 in 17 series).

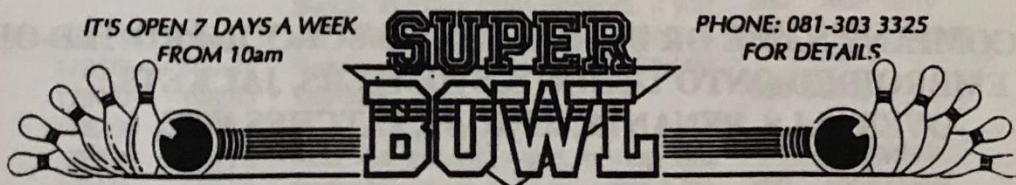

CLIFTONVILLE YBC's BOWLER OF THE YEAR

The Cliftonville YBC Annual Junior Bowler of the Year Tournament took place at the Top Ten Bowl on Sunday 24th April.

No less than 35 of our Juniors took part, all hoping to win one of the array of trophies on offer for the High Games and the Division winners and of course the coveted Shield for the overall winner.

Division 3 took to the lanes first, these being our youngest and newest bowlers, after their 3 games in third place with 531 was Stacey Cuthill, second with 545, Simon Hooper, but with just 3 pins more was our Division 3 winner, Joanne Cobby.

Young Emma Harwood made her debut after just three weeks bowling winning the Girls High Game Handicap Trophy with a 201.

Next on the lanes was our Division 2 bowlers, they bowled six games, changing lanes after every game. There was some excellent bowling that would not have looked out of place in Division 1. Last years overall winner, Michael Chang, took third place with 1087. In

second place was Amy Cole with 1107, Amy also took the trophy for the Girls High Game Scratch with a fine 170. With a marvellous total pinfall of 1213, this years Division 2 winner was Nigel Cruttenden and with that total Nigel also became the overall winner and took the 1994 Junior Bowler of the Year Shield, and just to add to his days collection, he also took the Boys High Game with handicap with a 225.

MICK CHAPMAN MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT

At Top Ten Bowl, Cliftonville a Triplex with Bonus Tournament was held in memory of Mick Chapman, late Chairman of the Cliftonville Bowlers Committee, President of the Seaside league and bowler in many leagues.
