Aren't team names fascinating Oh Shonet (Lisa Downs, Mark Lovett, Kevin Franks and Phillip Hackman) is a name I must ask more about! Kevin is a YBC newcomer - just 8 years old but already averaging 111. With Mark's experience (average 159) and the right enthusiasm from the team, we could well see Oh Shonet shining. Another potentially strong team are Us and Them (Andy and Lisa Wraight, Stuart Belcham and Helen Perkins). Kent player Helen with her ever-improving team could give the others a surprise or two this season. Andy has just made his first 200 (sadly, though not in the league) and sister Lisa is averaging 138. If she isn't close to a 150 average at the end of the season, I will be very surprised.

Bedrockers (Jennifer Beale, Anne Perkins, Katie Collins and Antony Cooper) must have derived their name from Jennifer's brother's team Flintstones, at least I hope so. Jennifer is already averaging 160, 20 or so more than at the end of last season and holds the girls high game 216 and series 545 for the season so far. Anne and Antony are also playing very well, both sporting averages of 128. Could the Bedrockers rock the Flintstones? Who knows.

And last but by no means least, the Pink Ladies (Rachel Thompson, Rebecca and Clair Ward and Kristina Collins) are the newest and one of the youngest teams. It may not be their year this year, but they should be aiming for the most improved bowlers awards this time around and next year who knows. Finally welcome to the Symes sisters - Pandora, Joanne and Anna, soon to be in a team I'm sure.
