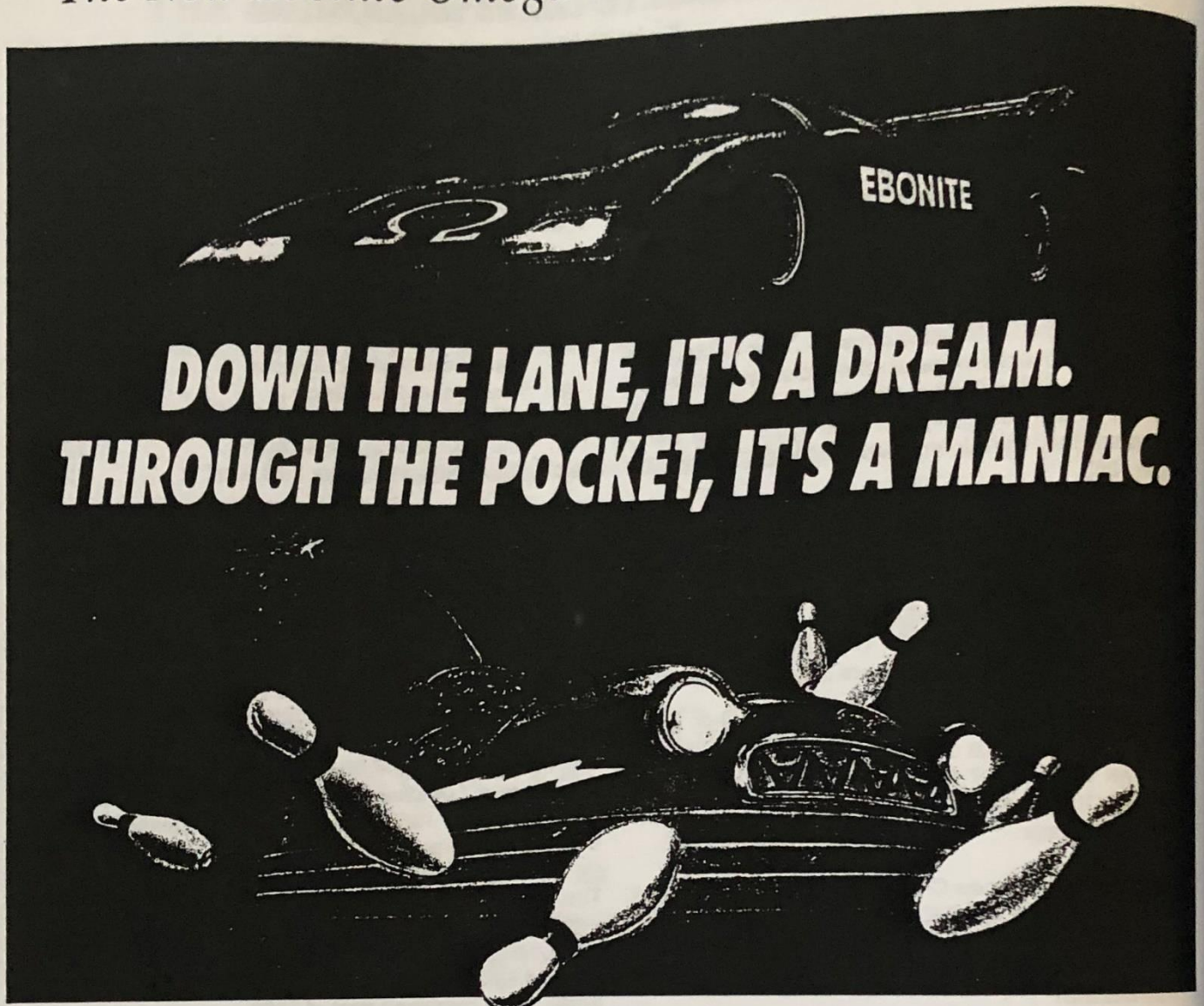

### OLYMPIC LEAGUE by Steve White

When we last reported "The Mean Machine" were about to play "Bunny Inc." and what a high scoring match it proved to be. In the first game "Bunny Inc." bowled a 1001 scratch but were beaten by a 1013. In the second game "Bunny Inc." had a 981 but again were beaten by "Mean Machine's" 1015. The last game was a bit low key after the first two, with "Bunny Inc." beating "Mean Machine" 925 - 895. In this match Cliff Dew had a 606 for "Bunny Inc." and Bob Hayter and Myself had 626 and 640 respectively for the "Mean Machine". The same week all this was going on, Robin Baxter bowled a 627 series.

To gloss over a few weeks high scores, Dave Fannon 611, Barry Downing 619, Helen Craig a personal best game of 180, John Amos 609, Dave Grant 605, Roy Myhill 622 and Mick Cope 618.

"Bunny Inc." set the scratch Team High Series in week 13, which lasted to the end of the season, with a 2999, helped largely by Dave Fannon with a 680 series (234, 235, 211) and Malcolm Fuller 652 (213, 204, 235). They also set the Team High Game scratch with 1068 which also lasted to the end of the season.

"Mean Machine" go back to the top of the league in week 14 after having dropped down to second place for a week. Lots of 600's this week, six in all, from Brian Savage 609, Bob Hayter 603, Keith Hodge 621, Dominic Jackson 621, Neil Webb 605 and Kevin Hollyhock 611.

As 600's seem to be getting more plentiful I'll, from now on, only mention the large ones and those from bowlers I have not as yet given a mention.

In week 15 Helen Craig set another personal best with a 199 game and a 479 series which gave her 259 and 659 with her handicap which was good enough for a reward at the end of the season. Tansel Oljay 645 and Robin Baxter 606 were the only other good scores from this week.

Week 16 was a good week for left handers, we had only 5 600's, all from left handers. The best being from Phil Eldridge 677 and Keith Hodge 657. I'll mention John Scotts 602 as I don't remember typing his name earlier.

Week 16 and "Mean Machine" have quite a healthy lead over "The Addicks" in second place, who are having a good season so far. "The Highwaymen" enjoyed the lanes as a personal best and a first for him, him being Alan Jones with a 700 dead which was made up of games of 245, 254, 201. His team mates, Chris Skudder and Alex Hoskins, backed him up with 626 and 604. Despite "The Highwaymen's" high scores they still lost 5-2 to "Glaze Rite" as three of their bowlers also had 600's, Paul Fletcher 628, Sheila White 621 and John Amos 613. Barry Wallace of "The Addicks" had a triple 200 with a 640 series.

No big scores in week 18 but "Glaze Rite" moved back into second place.

With a few weeks gone and the scores being very low due to hard lane conditions, week 23 was the next to produce better scores. By this time "Mean Machine" had increased their lead to a healthy 19 points.

A personal best in week 23 from Bruce Maguire with a 559. Bob Hayter was in the middle of a four week run of 600's (there what's the middle of a four week run), anyway he had four sixes on the trot (yes he does trot) 627, 661, 602 and 628.

Week 25 and "Mean Machines" lead is now 21 points. Dave Grant had a 618 series (I Don't think I've mentioned him yet) and Chris Skudder a 678 and a 270 game which he thinks is a personal best, but he's not quite sure.

Week 26 and Keith Hodge tried to rob Alan Jones of his League High Series but fell short by nine pins with a 691 (231, 225, 235).

A quick mention of Mick Brown, who in week 27 had a second game of 257 and a third of 203, shame about his 131 first game.

By week 28 "Mean Machines" lead was down to 20 points and "Bunny Inc." had gone into second place.

Week 29 and "Mean Machine" falter slightly as their lead is cut to 18 points. Sheila White (yes I know she's my wife but credit where credits due, she did have a good series) with games of 227, 215, 202 and a 644.

"Mean Machines" decline stopped in week 30, they increased their lead to an unstoppable 21 points.

Week 31 and "Glaze Rite" moved back into second place with a three point lead over third placed "Bunny Inc." Alex Hoskins had three 200's with 241, 205, 203 and a 649.

Week 32 and with one week to go "Mean Machine" have a 25 point lead over "Glaze Rite" who are 6 points ahead of "Bunny Inc." who are only one point in front of "The Blues Brothers" and "Bunny Inc." have to play the new league champions in the last week of the season.

In the season long Knockout Championship, I play John Scott over a two week aggregate score and after the first week I have a mere 46 pin lead.

And so to the last week of the season. A high scoring week.

In the match between "Mean Machine" and "Bunny Inc." Malcolm Fuller bowled a 648 series with a 241 game which as a series was 236 pins better than last week!!! Keith Hodge started with games of 247 and 202 but then lost his way with a 145. Chas Painter of "Glaze Rite" had a 633 (224, 207, 202) whilst Simon Carter had a 613 (207, 206, 200). Steve Dodd bowling his last game for "The Chessmen" had a 606 and the first six strikes in the centre Jackpot winning himself £20. Matt Bruce of "The Pinbusters" had a 616. Last but not least I had a 610 series which was good enough to defeat John Scott in the league Knockout competition.

Not a lot changed in that last week, "Mean Machine" winning the league by 23 points with "Glaze Rite" second, "Bunny Inc." third and four more teams



very close behind.

"Bunny Inc" are dropping out for the new season and "The Pro Shop" are taking their place but some of the "Bunny Inc." players will be staying with us in other teams.
