foul. All the various fouls are listed in the B.T.B.A. Rule Book which is supplied to every team captain but to refresh your memory a foul is

committed when:a) a part of the bowler's person encroaches upon or
goes beyond the foul line and touches any part of the lane equipment

or building during or after executing a legal delivery.
b) a ball is in play and a foul may be called after legal delivery has been made and until the same or another player is on the approach in position to make a succeeding delivery.

c) the foul light comes up or when the light does not come up provided in a) has definately

come up providing the encroachment as described in a) has definately been committed. i.e. if a player steps over the foul line but not on it and the light does not come up.
