THE ROAD TO MALMÖ

No fewer than SIX of the girls from S.E.B.A. are through the first stage of the WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP qualifying rounds. Together with our sole male representative JES MORLEY, the B.T.B.A. All Events Champion 1967, they will compete in the next round and we are of the opinion that more than one may well be wearing the British uniform at Malmo, Sweden in July this year. Jes went through to the next round at Preston by leading the local entrants at the Nottingham round by a good margin and LILY AHERN and ETHEL PARNELL, also from Southend, will compete in the next round at Wembley as they also got through playing at Nottingham. DORIN BAKER qualified at Walton and MARY BETTS. ANN HENDERSON and JANET MORRISON, from Basildon, Cliftonville and Bexleyheath respectively, topped all the other female entrants from the Dagenham round. MIKE LUCKHURST and PETE COOK from Whitstable and Bexleyheath narrowly failed in the men's division at this tough London round. Some very fine bowling has been witnessed at the twelve opening rounds where the top four men and top three women have qualified. Apart from the necessary qualifying averages all contestants had to bowl nine games in a row and when we tell you that some of the men averaged over 200 for the nine and some of the women over 190 you will realise that the standard is as tough as could be devised. A number of star bowlers have fallen by the wayside but of those remaining the selection committee's task in finding a male and female team is not to be envied.

Of the 48 men competing at Preston this week-end only the top 16 over nine games will go forward for final selection and only 12 of 36 ladies. Consistency, style, appearance, personality and the ability to be a good team player will influence the final selection of 9 men and 6 girls to represent their country and to all of them S.E.B.A. wish every success. We hope to publish full details of the teams finally selected in the next issue.

Following the proposal put forward and carried at the A.G.M. of the B.T.B.A. this year affiliation dues are now abolished. Once you join the Association you will not be asked any more for area dues if you, in fact, bowl in more than one area. Any player who joins in an area association other than S.E.B.A., however, and requires an area high score award will be asked for the cost price of the award. This was agreed by our delegates who considered that bowlers who did not contribute to area funds should not be subsidised by those who do.

At Chatham a new 5 person Scratch League is hoping to commence


operations in September and all being well will roll on a Thursday evening. Interested teams should contact RON GLASSON, 9, Street End Road, CHATHAM.


