

Following the outstanding success of Great Britain in the 1967 World Championships in Malmo there are now many more fields to conquer. Two players are required to visit Caracas for a large International Doubles Tournament in Venezuela later this year, the 2nd. Annual Triple Crown Championship is being held in Wales in 1968, the European Championships are being planned for Paris and a new European Tournament is now to commence on an annual basis. In memory of the late F.I.Q. Vice President Emilio de Miguel the event will bear his name and will be open to all member countries of the World Governing Body, F.I.Q. It will be zoned on similar lines to the Football World Cup and subject to confirmation Great Britain have drawn Belgium, Spain and Holland in round one, with an excellent chance of making the finals.

More news on this subject as soon as possible but meanwhile please give every support to the lottery that is being run at all centres.

All proceeds go to the International Fund for the British Teams and as will be seen a lot of money will be required this coming season. Great Britain are on top of the World in Tenpin – help us to stay there!

At the meeting of the F.I.Q. at Salzburg in July it was proposed and passed unanimously by all the member countries present that F.I.Q. sanction for International Tournaments would only be granted providing the lanes in question had been certified by the governing body of the country that was to hold the tournament. Great Britain is the only country that allows it's players to compete in a non sanctioned International in any event. This means that no players from abroad can compete in this country on lanes measured by surveyors and no such tournament can be run at such a centre. What how?
