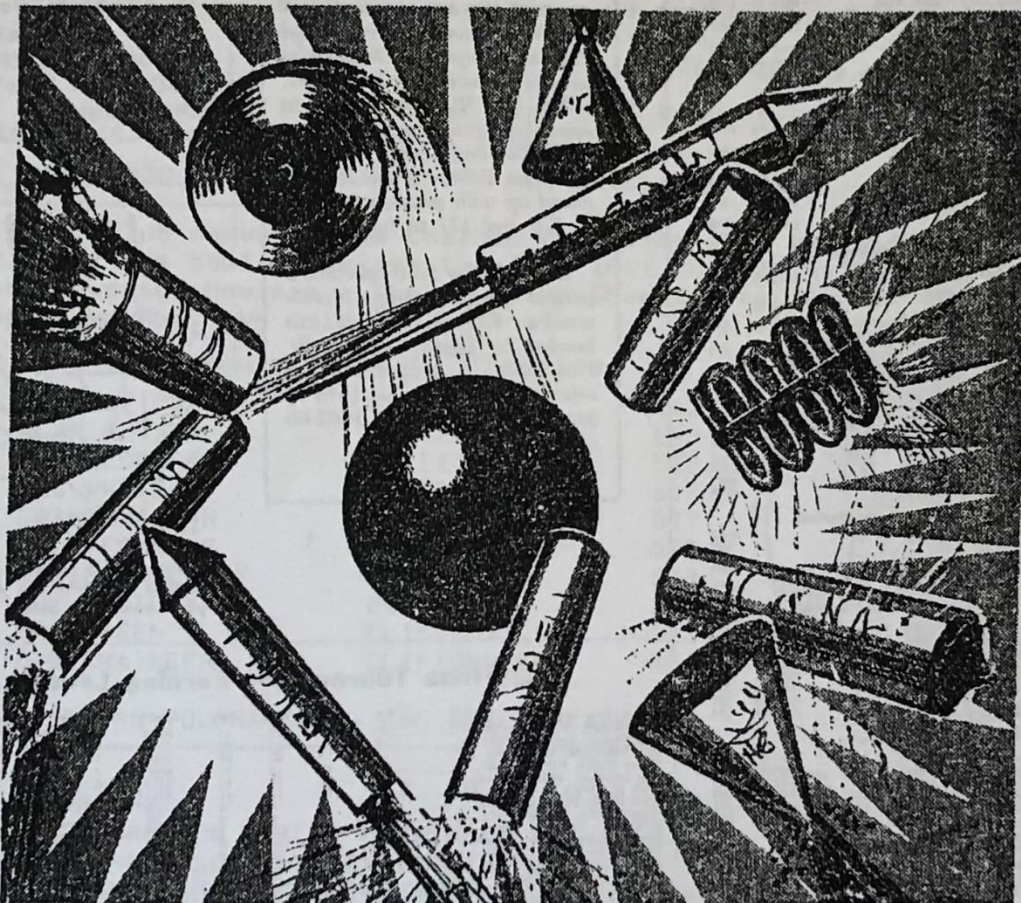

Doris Crawford, a 152-average bowlerette from Miami, Fla., bowled the seventh 300 game of the season sanctioned by the Woman's International Bowling Congress. Doris, who has been bowling for four years, rolled her 12 strike game to open her series in the Shores Social Bowling League at Boulcrama on February 18. She followed up with consistent games of 170 and 171 to total a 641 series.

It is only the third sanctioned perfect game among Florida women. The most recent was bowled by Linda Laud of St. Petersburg, last season, and the other was by Virginia Celli of Jacksonville during the 1965-66 season.

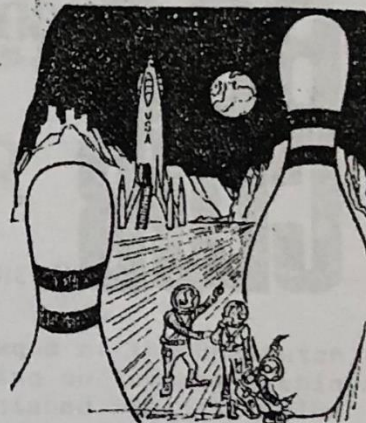

30th. NOVEMBER - 4th. ANNUAL S.E.B.A. CLASSIC SINGLES @ TOP RANK CHATHAM.

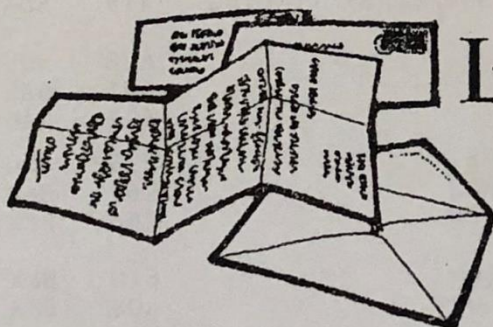
Scratch bowling only - 5 games across 10 lanes. Entry Forms are already out. Entry Closing Date 21st. November.

"LUCKY" EDDIE CHAPMAN rolls lead-off and is accused of rolling a dead flat, centre of the lane ball. He seems to get all the breaks but luck like that does not last over 150 games so he must have a secret somewhere. With a 174+ average you won't find him calling it luck.

JANET MORRISON keeps the boys apart and yet holds the team together at number 2. We all know how well she can bowl and on her day she's a match for any man(I am still talking about bowling!)

COLIN CROWTHER is one of the best anchors in the business. His best average before this season was 174 but it is now 185 over the 36 games bowled this Summer. When asked to what he credited this improvement he answered very typically, "Buzz Morrison, Dick Weber and a team that bowls every ball with me and sweats each one out as much as I do". Colin, who inspired me to write this report has recently completed a fabulous Tuesday night performance by rolling 8 successive 200's and three 600's. His scores went like this - 187-205-211=603 200-214-217=631 235-213-201=649. With an anchor like that who needs a reserve!

During the last 12 months this team have dropped only 38 points out of a possible 147 and have been beaten only eight times in 49 matches. Only once in those 49 matches have they failed to pick up a point. Well done the MISHAPS - let's see you at the top this time in 1970.

That bowling standards in your area continue to rise by leaps and bounds is self evident by the above listing - the first of the new season! As mentioned last month the high game is already a 299 from Mick Burridge and in addition the Wembley All Stars have shattered their own record of last season with a formidable 3 person team series of 1899 rolled in the Dagenham Masters League. Del Brough had top set of 672 followed by Loke Coleman on 629 and low man Bobby Mansfield with 598! The following week the same team hit 1872 with Mansfield this time top man with 637, Brough backing him up on 623 and 'low man' Roger Cook having 612. On the 5-man front it is nice to see the newly reformed Committee team back among the high spots and already leading both sections with 2824 and 994. More yet to come? The regular Saturday afternoon Bexleyheath tournament the Saturday Pairs continues to hit the headlines and no fewer than six of the above doubles scores come from this event. More next month.
