A tradition of the new year is the New Year Resolution. Could all league fficers be asked to resolve that in 1966 the important duties of their respective offices be carried out better than in 1965? We are not saying that our leagues in ent are badly run - far from it. Certain aspects however are not given the mportance that they deserve. Whilst no major troubles have occurred to date a number of minor catastrophies could have been averted and some ill feeling avoided and each league secretary compiled a Constitution. Similarly incidents and worries ould have been eliminated had the league president checked the league cash balance

as deposited in the bank each and every month.

There is no need for the secretary to type the complete Constitution for istribution to every team captain, although some in fact have the facilities to do his and make a very fine job of it. All that is really required is for each captain to be in possession of the B.T.B.A. Rulo Book at the time when the league decides pon it's playing rules prior to each season. This booklet contains all the playing hd rule options you will require and as each section is voted and agreed upon the necessary deletions etc. can be made as you go along. All the secretary than has to ro is to make out one extra copy (about a ten minute job) for tranmission to the rea Secretary and the job is then complete until the following season without trouble or sweat. Once the captains have their permanent record of the rules the secretary will be worried far less with queries and in consequence should be able

o concentrate more on his own bowling!

The president's position in the league is far more important than many people realise. The ideal person is one who can conduct a meeting in such a way that t proceeds in a businesslike manner and without deviating from the point. Primarily between it is the president's duty to safeguard the league's prize money. The treasurer's job is an unenviable one and nearly all undertake their duties in a quiet and efficient manner. It is not unknown in this country, however, for the man who olds the purse strings to be somewhat irresponsible and for him not to bank the weekly funds in the prescribed manner, resulting in losses, shortages, queries and sometimes the league having little or no money at the end of the season with which purchase trophies. Nothing can be more demoralising for a league, following a ong and strenuous season to have little or no money with which to purchase trophies and instances of this nature must not be allowed to happen in the Kent Area. As pon as a league is formed the treasurer, in conjunction with the president, must pen an account in the name of the league. Thereafter the funds must be deposited weekly by the treasurer and an arrangement made with the bank for the monthly statements to be sent to the president, who, after checking it with the books passes t to the treasurer for his records. In order that the whole of the league can see that their money is safe the president must arrange to indicate on the B.T.B.A. Standing Sheet the amount of the monthly balance and sign it, thus showing to one hd all that he has done his job.

Only two small resolutions but two that can make 1966 a really happy and

prosperous new year for you all.

Bredehoft of Ohio just when he was in the middle of one of the greatest tournament performances in bowling history. The 53 year old postman rolling in the Ohio Major Bowlers Association Tournament fired no fewer than 20 consecutive 200 games to equal the World record of St. Louis Dich Weber in the 1962 World Invitational. Bredehoft lost his chance to break the record in the 10th. frame of his final game when he unaccountably fouled on his first delivery finishing with a 186. It was embarrasing enough to have the string ended in that manner and particularly on live T.V. but to make matters worse he nearly lost the Championship due to this mistake. Dennis Taylor of Cleveland needed a double on his last frame to take the title but just failed with a strike and nine. Averaging 222 for the 24 games Bredehoft in fact won in the end by just the one pin earning himself 1000 dollars. The series started with two 200 games and Don then dropped to a 196. He then started the fantastic string scoring 225, 247, 234, 213, 237, 227, 203, 258, 236, 235, 222, 226, 216, 200, 201, 247, 226, 213, 209 and 216.

ROSEMARY LANGMAN of the Bexleyheath HITS & MISSES League is only the second bowler at this centre to qualify for the A.M.F. +100 Award. Holding a 100 average Rosemary followed a game of 93 with a 202. Having a turkey and a line of spares she 'blew' in the ninth frame and wanted a minimum of a spare and 6 pins for her first ever 200 game. She drew the 5-10 split! Undeterred however she picked it up as clean as a whistle and went out with an 8 count. Looking very white faced and surprised with herself Rosemary has started the New Year well and is an example of what can be achieved at this unpredictable sport of tenpin.

Contrary to the rumour in the Christmas issue of "Bowling News" it has now, in fact, been confirmed that the perfect game by a British bowler has been duly sanctioned! A B.T.B.A. communique received a few days ago reads as follows:-

"On December 5th. 1965 Mr. ALBERT KIRKHAM who normally/at Hanley,
Stoke-on-Trent, relied a perfect game in a sanctioned doubles tournament at Chaster,
and became the first British member of the B.T.B.A. to obtain this recognition since

The score was ratified on Wednesday, 28th. December 1965."

## BOWLING MIRROR

It appears that members of the B.T.B.A. will shortly have their own official organ of the Association. A B.T.B.A. communique reads as follows:-

"As a result of successful negotiations with a firm of publishers, it is now anticipated that a tabloid to be known as The Bowling Mirror will be produced towards the end of February 1966. This will be known as the official organ of the B.T.B.A. and will be available free of cost to all B.T.B.A. league members. It is regretted that the high cost of postal charges prohibits direct mailing, and the tabloid will, therefore, be forwarded to league secretaries for distribution to those members who have paid their dues through that league"

This nows is very welcome indeed and with Tenpin Monthly or Tenpin Occasionally as it is slowly being called, plus the Bowling Mirror plus of course this little publication the needs of tempin should be adequately covered in 1966 and for the future.

A word here to league secretaries. Bake sure that you are aware of the actual bowlers who joined the B.T.E.A. through your league. If, for example, your league consists of 42 players and you receive 25 copies of Bowling Mirror it means that that only 25 people actually paid their substhrough your league. Only copies of the publication that belong to the paid mamber should be given to him. If this is not done properly it will mean that some bowlers are receiving two or more copies of the tabloid and others none at all. If any secretary is unsure at this stage of who joined through his league and who didn't he should contact the Area Secretary without delay. In assessing the number of members paid through your league do not forget those who joined after the sanction was received.
