Norma Bridge Tragedy

In the early hours of Thursday morning, 21st May, Norma Bridge was killed in a road accident while returning from Assistant Manager duty at the ABC Bowl, Dagenham. Three others also lost their life including centre mechanic Colin Wessom. Norma, wife of Nomad's skipper Bill Bridge, was only in her middle thirties and will long be remembered as one of the nicest people in bowling. She always had a smile and a pleasant word for everyone and she will be sorely missed both at Bagenham and at Bexleyheath where she had bowled in league for the past five years. Norma was Bexleyheath House Champion in 1967, rolled the highst series in the land in 1968- a fabulous 678, and with Myra Kelsey and Janet Morrison represented Bexleyheath in the Ladies London League where they broke National records galore. In latter years she had concentrated more on the administrative side of the game and had always been a first class instructor, particularly with children. An A.M.F. Forum Instructor her knowledge of the game proved to the benefit of many. Our deepest sympathies go out to Bill Bridge and her great friend John Paull, who was the only witness to the tragic occurrence.

Area Champs 1970!

As forcast the 8th. Annual S.E.B.A. Championships were the biggest yet! No fewer than 224 singles were bowled together with 141 doubles and 56 five person teams. 144 entered the All Events and the total prize fund without a sponsorship of any kind was a record £600 all but a few shillings. The team event and doubles were bowled on the second floor of the ABC Bowl, Bexleyheath against new pins and scores were more difficult to come by than usual. The singles were played exclusively on the lower level against pins that had been used before and it was on lanes 1-12 that the big series came. A report, division by division, is given below and the scratch scores are official but the handicap totals are UNRATIFIED at this stage.

Our thanks to all members for the wonderful support for our championships which makes them the largest of their kind in Great Britain, to the legion of official scorers without whom an event of this size would be impossible, to Alan Chapman, Colin Crowther, Brian Newson, Doris and Bill Ainger who all worked so hard over the two day event, to the others who gave their time and energies and to the bowl management team of Buzz Morrison, Ron Hills, Don MacNaughton and Mrs. Fisher who coped so very well with all our needs. And last but not least to chief mechanic Alan Wilkinson and his team who did a wonderful job in completing the whole tournament without a single stoppage of any kind.
