British Girls In U.S.A.

Following a variety of practise matches the Great Britain Ladies team left Heathrow Airport on 7th. May for the U.S.A. , the first time in American bowling history that British girls had competed there. Arriving in New York they went on to Cleveland where practise and exhibition matches were arranged until 11th. May when they moved on to the home of the American Bowling Congress. Milwaukee. More practise and exhibition games and a tour of the A.B.C. Headquarters and then on to Tulsa, Oklahoma via Chicago on 13th. May. More practise and then straight into the Women's International Bowling Congress Annual Championships where the team events were played on the 16th and the singles and doubles on the following day. On 18th. May, still at the Yale Bowl, Tulsa, the 12 girls plunged into the 'Queens' Tournament, the top event for ladies anywhere in the World. Friday, 22nd. May saw the team off to Los Angeles, California where, again, there were exhibition matches prior to the Queen Mary Tournament staged at Long Beach. The team is due to return from California by Jumbo Jet on 27th. May and to arrive at London Airport on Friday, 29th. May. The match results from Tulsa are detailed below but these give no indication of the fantastic welcome given by the American bowling fraternity to our girls. Wined, dined, feted and generally treated like royalty they had, up until Tulsa, appeared on live television no less than six times and had given countless radio interviews. In view of all this how they managed to play so very well is not known - but they did!

REPORT FROM TEDDY TINLING - DUBLIN

It was roses all the way at the 4th. Triple Crown Championships held this year in Dublin. British Men's Team Captain, Bobby Mansfield, set himself the task not only of retaining the English title, but of winning it by the largest margin for four years. He and his team succeeded in this by 5½ points and 12 pins over England's previous best from Scotland in 1967. Formal results were:-
