34 - 600's In One Event

Held at the Princess Bowl, the Dagenham 10th. Anniversary Tournament attracted all the countries top tenpin talent who duly had a scoring spree. Each of the 12 teams of six players bowled 3 doubles, 2 trios and a 5 person team and from the 72 actual competitors there were no fewer than 34 series of over 600 bowled with 139 games of 200 or more. Until someone comes up with something better this one is being claimed as the highest scoring tournament ever in this country!

The early leaders were the Brunswick Jets when CHRIS PETTY bowled 655 on the first doubles squad backed by BOB RODGERS on 599 for a fine 1254. Close behind were the Sceptres on 1201 with DES RICHARDSON on 612 and JOHN DAWSON backing with 589. Squad two helped the Wambley All Stars and the Committee to pull back some leeway when ROGER COOK and RAY HAGGAN for the Wembley side made 1202 and CHRIS LEAVY and MALCOLM NICHOLLS for the Bexleyheath lads had 1194. The Jets held their lead, however, with a steady 1169 from DAVE SMITH and JAN ROZE. The Harry Stiller Racers came into the reckoning after the third doubles squad having bowled three very steady series of well into 1100. The Jets were still the leaders though

with BRIAN WILKINS and BRUCE PEARCE making 1151.

The first of the trios squads made an entirely different picture as the Jets started to struggle and the Nomads, who were well down the list, sank even further. The new leaders were the Wembley All Stars whose team of PHIL RUSSELL(567), COLIN PRESLAND(637) and RAY HAGGAN(623) totalled a fine 1827. The Stiller's side kept in the running with a solid 1706 and the Sceptres kept up the pressure on 1712. The second trios line up put the lid on a number of hopes including the Jets, Committee and Mallory Chargers but brought Stillers and the All Stars within 7 pins of each other at the top of the table and enabled the Greyhounds and Nomads to still have a slight chance with the 5 person team squad still to come. Stillers three, JON REEVES(630), DAVE POND(566) and DAVE TAYLOR(580) totalled 1776 and the All Stars with ROGER COOK making 644 had 1763. BRIAN MICHAEL was top man with 616 in the Greyhound's 1746 but it was the 'old school' of WILL CLARKE, LES GEORGE and RAY HOOK who topped the squad with 1802. LES GEORGE had 652 and RAY HOOK 602.

The final team squad was a real thriller. The All Stars looked almost sure to take the top spot when opening with a 971 game against Stiller's 897 but the men from Poole are made of stern stuff and came right back with a 1034 to the All Stars 956. The Nomads had a 1010 starter but seemed to have too much to do when their second game was only 925. Stillers closed with 952 to the All Stars 924 and took top spot. The All Stars were second and the Nomads shot into 3rd position with a final game of 1075 that gave them their second 3000 set of the week, this time a 3010. The Greyhounds were fourth. The 'ESSEX SHIELD' was one of the most famous tournaments for five person teams ever held in this country. Always associated with the Grays Bowl the event has been in limbo since Grays closed it's doors. Now under the S.E.B.A. Tournament Banner the new 1970 'ESSEX SHIELD' is to be held at the ABC Princess Bowl, Dagenham commencing 1st. November.

The tournament is for scratch teams and around 50 have been

invited with the FIRST 36 ACCEPTORS ONLY being able to participate. prize fund on this basis will be over £250 with a first prize of £100.

The first round on November 1st. will consist of 3 squads of 12 teams and the top 12 qualifiers go through to the second round on November 8th. Here ALL BOWLING WILL BE FREE and the tournament will be decided over 6 games, as against 3 in the first round, with the top five

teams cashing. Entry fee per team is only £7.10.0d with the standard lineage charge being paid on the first day. Since then he has accomplished another three times and in the Degenham Masters League two weeks ago he did it for a fifth time! From our records this is the first time in Great Britain that a player has achieved five 700's and it could well be a European Record as well. Very well done Colin - keep it up.

How the hell can an industry ever survive when those at the helm publically pull it to pieces? Allie Brandt's all time three game series record of 886 has withstood the challenges of the World's finest bowlers since October 25th, 1939, but three bowlers in the U.S.A. have made bold bids to overtake the old master who is now in his 68th. year.

Latest to come close to Brandt's 31 year old mark was NELSON BURTON JNR., well known St. Louis professional. The 27 year old Burton exploded for an 869 series while competing in a doubles tournament at the Corpus Christi Lanes in Mound City. His games were 279, 300 and 290! Prior to Burton's blast, little known Carl Wilsing of

Sheboygan, Wisconsin in 1966 soared to within 10 pins of Brandt's record and would have beat it had he not been tapped on an 8 pin in the 10th. frame of his third game. He was actually ahead of Brandt's total after two games when he opened with 298 and 300 to Brandt's 297 and 289. Wilsi closed with a 278, however, to Brandt's 300.

The third threat to the 886 in recent years also came in 1966 when Testa Semiz of New Jersey fired an 867 on games of 299, 268 and 300.

There are many who contend that Allie Brandt's total is virtually unbeatable and point to the fact that if a bowler begins any or his three games with two spares and then strikes throughout, that the most he could score would be 879! Think about it!

Prior to his mighty 869 which included a record 34 strikes Nelson Burton had set an all time World record for a doubles series with partner Billy Walden when he made another 800 series, this time an 804. His partner went with him for an 810 to total a record 1614 beating the old mark of 1609 set in 1963 by Lou Celestino (842) and Jim Troyano (767). This was the first time in history that two players in doubles had both gone over the 800 barrier. Later in the tournament Walden hit two more series over 800 with 821 and 824. Had the two bowler's best totals been matched together the new World record to beat would have been 1693!

VICKY'S NEW STANDARD

VICKY TIMMS, who has had a little bit of a rough time in mastering a new ball, has really been hitting the scores of late down Whitstable way. Following her Area Hi record game of 277 she now tops the season's listing for ladies series as well. Bowling in the Seaside League on 22nd. August she put together games of 266-204-212 for a new Area Record score of 682. Well done. Vicky - keep 'em rolling.

Kent Ladies in County Finals

The ladies from Kent have won their way through to the finals of the Inter County Championships finishing with 44 points to Surrey's 38 Middlesex's 36 and Sussex's 10. The Kent men finished third in their section as did the Essex ladies and both must wait until next year to try their hand again. The most unlucky side were the Essex men who totalled London side had a slightly higher total pinfall and Essex, who had a qualifying average of 912, must await next year for revenge.

The news is very sad particularly as the centre has appeared to be doing so well of late. However company policy is company policy and it can only be hoped that the majority of the regular bowlers will not be lost to the sport. With this in mind Bexleyheath, Dagenham and Whitstable will do their utmost to find places for bowlers, teams and leagues. On a brighter note it is understood that there is still a chance of Cliftonville reopening. We wait further news of a more definate nature, however, before giving details.
