Over 100 team entries ensured another successful tournament for Bexleyheath with a total prize fund nearly £300. Teams from as far afield as Liverpool, Sheffield, Bournemouth and Guernsey in the Channel Islands competed throughout the day with the final squad coming off at just after riderichted. squad coming off at just after midnight.

The early leaders were the two teams who had travelled the furthest, the LOBOS from Liverpool and the JASPERS from Guernsey with handicap totals of 1705 and 1767 respectively. The 12.45p.m. squad brought about a radical change in the placings, however, as the MALLORY CHARGERS "A" team hit 1786 actual, 1903 handicap with JOHN WELLS howling 619 and TOM GLEGNYON 621 WELLS bowling 619 and TOM O'CONNOR 621. The Jaspers, with their re-entry went up to second position in the handicap division with 1812 and despite a number of gallant attempts these two scores were destined to stand up for the remainder of the competition. The SILVER STARS from the home centre also came into the money on this shift with 1791, closely followed by the BRISTOL CHESSMEN on 1790 and the PINTOPPERS of

Aylesbury totalling 1770.

The 2.15p.m. squad saw the HARRY STILLER RACERS go into the lead in the scratch section with 1805 led by DAVE STAPLES on 647. The MALLORY CHARGERS "B" came into third place handicap with 1805 with the DOUBLE I's of Tolworth breathing closely down their neck on 1793. Top spot on the 4p.m. squad went to THE COMMITTEE with 1693 actual and 1804 handicap with BRIAN NEWSON shooting the highest series of the day on a fine 660. The Dagenham NOMADS went into the placings with a 1716 scratch led by WILL CLARKE with 621. There were no changes in the top positions on the 5.45p.m. shift although the WEMBLEY ALL STARS came into minor placing with a scratch score of 1671 and the TRAVELLERS of Chatham and the Bexleyheath SCORPIONS both played well. The Crawley team SILVERLINE were top of the 7.15p.m. with a handicap total of 1803 and DEL BROUGH for the All Stars re-entry made a 614 but his team were not able to improve upon their first total. The SCEPTRES, however, radically improved upon their first effort when, on the 9p.m. run they took top spot scratch with a fine 1818 with GEDFF LIDDIARD equalling Brian Newson's top set of 660.
