In just four weeks of the new year no less than SIX such super sets have been bowled all at - yes Dagenham!


Next on the band wagon was WILL CLARKE who had been striving for a 700 for months and in the process had recorded a number of 690 plus series including two 699's! He had to break through and on games of 224-244-243 he at last made it for a 711 in the Dagenham Doubles. He decided to re-enter the tournament for the squad that followed and this time bowled 245-234-236 for a 715 - yes the first back to back 700's that have been recorded anywhere in Europe! Enough? No - Will came back the following Saturday and proceeded to hit games of 259-204-243 for his third 700, this time a 706!

Meanwhile ROGER COOK in the Masters League after a shaky opener of 179 blasted games of 258 and 266 for a 703 and S.E.B.A's Bowler of the Year, LES GEORGE, helped himself to his third 700 with a 709 in the Supreme League. If things continue in this vein for the remainder of 1971 S.E.B.A. will have to consider a '700 Club' Tournament!


