

Sixty bowlers, 240 games played and each bowler's four games rolled on a different pair of lanes. A tough format for any 5 person team event and one where the scores would not be expected to be on the high side. But this is Dagenham! 75 games of 200 plus were hit together with 8 team games of over 1000 and no fewer than 11 competitors made over the 800 mark. In fact the overall average for the complete tournament was a fantastic 185.6

Opening with respective games of 961, 978 and 976 the Wemblay All Stars, Ambassador Bowling Ltd and Brunswick Jets vied with one another throughout with the Nomads never far behind. The All Stars with consecutive games of 1055, 1003 and 1028 clinched the title, however, with the Ambassador coming in with a strong finish on games of 1005 and 1016.
