

DAGENHAM HI SCORES - WHY ?

'Bowling News' asked Dagenham Centre Manager and former SEBA President, BRIAN MORRISON, why so many high scores are coming from his centre and to answer the comments that we have heard to the effect that they are all being bowled on one particular pair of lanes. We taped his reply which went as follows:-

"Firstly Dagenham has always been a high scoring centre but it is only since a number of the leagues have been BTBA sanctioned that the scores have become known as 'official'. Tony Spavins rolled a 300 game here nearly 8 years ago and Maggie Fullick a 295 game some 4 years ago. Neither was sanctioned so outside Dagenham the scores are unknown. With bowlers of the calibre of Mansfield, George, Presland, Brough, Clarke, Saunders, Wilkens, Cook etc etc rolling in league regularly at the centre high scores; if conditions are right, must come and with the extra incentive brought about by the top opposition in such leagues as the

high scores; if conditions are right, must come and with the extra incentive brought about by the top opposition in such leagues as the Masters and Supreme the scores DO come! Most top players like the lanes at Dagenham. Why? They have been dressed in the same way by the same man for over 10 years giving a consistency

of conditions that possibly no other centre can boast. Dur lanesman, 74 year old George Swift, takes extreme pride in his job and in the scores although he has never bowled a ball in his life! What we try to do is to give the bowler conditions where. any bias put on the ball is translated into a degree of movement commensurate with the release - no more and no less. This means that the player is rolling his natural ball and with the same amount of turn on each pair of lames has the best chance to play at peak. Of course conditions are such that we don't always succeed in pleasing everybody all the time but we do

try and the successes that have been had are very gratifying to the effort involved. As far as the scores all being shot on one pair of lanes are concerned most centres have a favourite pair and Degenham has it's favourite two pairs, namely 17-18 and 19-20. A number of the high scores have, naturally, been rolled on one pair or the other but certainly not all! End lanes 13-14 have seen a 728 and 23-24 a 717, 709 and 3171 team set. 21-22 boast a 704, 705 and 710 and so it goes on. The lanes are not grooved, trick dressed and neither are the pins specially spotted as any B.T.B.A. representative who has had occasion to certify the centre will testify. We are proud to bill ourselves as 'Europe's Highest Scoring Bowl' and obviously hope that our claim can be maintained in the future."

For mixed doubles PAT GORDON and BARRY WILKENS with 607 and 622 respectively made second spot in the Area Hi's with a 1229 and the big games of Russell and Brough gave them series totals of 1369 and 1376 - remarkable scoring by any standards. The big 751 of the Nomads gave them a series of 1998 - good enough for third place in the listings would you believe?

Other big ones to enter the listings were from the Bexleyheath Guys and Dolls League where last month DOROTHY NICHELSON and COLIN CROWTHER smashed the Area Game Record with 210 and 278 respectively for a great 488 and where this month JANET MORRISON came within two pins of the Area Record for ladies with a 665 set including a 256 game. With this series Janet boosted her average to a very fine 190 over 69 games, not only the highest of any bowler in the centre but the highest average over this number of games ever held by a lady bowler anywhere in Europe!
