



The last 700 before the new lenes was the biggest and another new House Record! Bowling in the SPARTAN DOUBLES LEAGUE only 4 days before the work began on the league lanes and rolling his bell through sawdust from the downstairs lanes ALAN WILKINSON fired strikes galore with games of 235-278-242 for a magnificent 755 set. This brings the total number of 700's rolled within the Area THIS SEASON only to TWENTY!
