KE T'S HIGHEST EVER GAME

Rolling for Wellington Motors in the Olympic League at Bexleyheath on 10th. February Pat Duggan really hit a string of strikes. Striking in the first frame of the second game Pat went on striking right up to the tenth frame. On the deventh delivery the whole of the 70 bowler league held their breath. The ball was a good one but a shade slower than the first ten and in consequence came up a little high on the head pin. It could have struck but unfortunately the 6 pin was stubbor and Pat finished with a 288 game and a series of 667, the highest so far this seaso in the Kent Area. Special badges have been ordered by the Area showing in black the legend "288" and "10X". The nearest yet to a 300 in Kent - maybe it wont be long after all.

ONE PIN WORTH 500 DOLLARS!

First prize in the Pat Harkins Classic Tournament in Illinois was 1000 dollars. The highest scratch series over 5 games was declared the winner and the runner up received 500 dollars. With 1083 pins Ed Besse took first place with Chuck Wagner just one pin behind with a 1082! In top league or tournament play it often pays to be certain of the one pin in a big split rather than attempt a conversion and miss them both. It could cost you money and a title.

A NEW SPONSORED TEAM

Les Jarman writes to tell us of the newly sponsored 5 man tean based at Chatham, the "Audeovid Record 5" sponsored by the Audeovid Record dealers of Star Hill, Rochester. The teams first match in a series of challange matches was against the formidable Committee from Bexleyheath. Caring nothing for reputations and caring not for the tannoy announcement that their opponents two days previously had rolled a 1010 game and 2771 series the Audeovids ran out winners over the series by 38 pins, high series by John Mitchell, 569 and John Court 532. For the Committee Tom Turner was high man with 538 followed by Buzz Morrison with 535.

The return match was also a real cracker with John Mitchell again the high man on 516 and Andy Brown closely behind him with 509. On this occasion however the Committee were in devasting form and opening with a game of 1003 they proceeded to roll 2791 which the Record 5 just could not hold. High men were skipper Dog Bit Davis and Bill Bridge, both with 578. It is understood that a decider is to be arranged at a neutral bowl. It should be worth watching.

Following with games of 181 and 199 Tom clocked a 626 - his first 600. Next time this happens we suggest that Tom should roll in his pyjamas - you never know it could be a 700!

He made his eleven in a row and finishing with an eight count he took the title with a great series of 729. One of the finest finishes in American tournament history.

2853 FOUR MAN SERIES!

The Top Score Lane Maintenance Four playing Braasch Bowling Supply Four in league at the the Freeway Bowl, California in January this year set the 4 man team record for the U.S.A. for the 1965/66 season. Top Score opened with an 863 game against their opponent's 834 and then with games of 278, 266, 246 & 224 they hit a 1014 team game - and lost! Braasch with 299, 268, 246 & 204 made 1017, a U.S.A. season's record. Top Score took the third game with a 976 totalling 2853, the 7th highest in bowling history for a four man team. Beat that!
