## NEW NEWS

The NORWICH CLUB BOWL in Plumstead Road, Norwich opened it's doors in December and commenced it's league programme in January. The centre has eight AMF equipped machines and lanes and is the latest centre to open in this country. WEST GERMANY vs GREAT BRITAIN - we all know about the football match but on 27th. February at the Ambassador Bowl, Hounslow is staged the tenpin bowling version. Twelve West German keglers will compete against this country's top talent.

Entries to the 11th. Annual B.T.B.A. Champion-ships are some 25% up on last year and there is an entry of 100 five person teams.

The second issue of the Tenpin Sport is out and it is bigger and better than issue No. 1 and very good value for just 3p. The Committee, however, are just a little puzzled as to how they became billed as Kent Area champions (they were in 1964!) and how they managed to roll a DOUBLES total of 2996!!!

Since January 1st. it has been necessary, when bowling in international tournaments sanctioned by the F.I.Q., to be in possession of an international bowling licence. These can be obtained through the B.T.B.A. at a fee of £2.00. The application form duly completed should be forwarded to 19, Canterbury Avenue, Ilford, Essex together with two passport size photographs. # A WELCOME RETURN

To many newer bowlers GEORGE STEER is a new name. In fact George has been in bowling since 1961 and represented Great Britain in the 1963 World Championships in Mexico and in the 1964 European Championships in Birmingham. Going into retirement after his marriage he was brought back onto the scene by The Committee and after a slow start has now got back to a 180 average and has starting hitting 600's again - none was more welcome than the fine 631 he put in at Basildon to win the 1971 600 Club Tournament!

55 members competed in the event and scoring was high with five 600's bowled. JES MORLEY set the standard with a fine 606 off the 5p.m. squad, KEITH PAIN took the lead with 617 on the 6p.m. squad and on the final outing NIGEL HOLGATE, ROGER BRIGHT and GEORGE STEER all had a go with George making the grade. Bowling between power cuts on Saturday and throughout the whole of Sunday most of the top female players in Great Britain put on a fine show to a good audience and final placings were in doubt to the end.

Last years holder, PAULINE BOWRY from Tolworth, made a bad start with a 159 game but got into her stride in time to pull up to third place before her 5 games were over. CAROLE COLLIER from Slough was lagging somewhat after her first 4 games but the high singles game of the event, a 235, put her to within 6 pins of the winner HILDA CLIFFORD.

The local bowlers fared particularly well in this event and none more so than PETER SUTTON who recorded a 279 game, the third highest in the Area so far this season.


## A.G.M.

The Annual General Meeting of the Association was duly held in the Princess Club of the Dagenham Bowl and a good number of delegates attended from all seven centres. Scheduled to last for about 2 hours the meeting, in fact, went on for nearly 4 hours and in general the proceedings were quite lively. Chairmen of the various working sub-committees gave their reports and answered questions as did the Secretary, President and Vice Presidents. On the Executive for the first time were bowling centre managers who, under the new 'togetherness' policy within bowling were invited onto S.E.B.A. subject to continuance at the A.G.M. which was duly endorsed by the delegates.

Since commencement of the B.T.B.A. National Award Programme there has been no need to continue the Area Badge scheme and delegates agreed that those badges remaining could be disposed of on a first come, first served basis. With this in mind a list of badges remaining in stock will be published in Bowling News each month until stocks are exhausted. The first list will appear next month.

A new Area tournament was also approved, the S.E.B.A. Inter-Centre Championships, and full details of this will also be laid out in next month's issue of this publication.
