BIGGER AND BIGGER AND BIGGER !

Ten years ago our first Area Championships were held at the old Top Rank Bowl at Chatham before even the majority of our present centres had opened their doors. In 1962 the affair was quite small by present day standards and at that time no one could have been aware of the size to which the Championships would grow. Every succeeding year the event became bigger and bigger until in 1972 the entries totalled over 1,000 and five days were necessary to fit everyone in. The event is correctly labelled as the largest area tournament in Great Britain and although the South Eastern Bowling Association is not, by any stretch of the imagination, the biggest area association in the country certainly you, our member, supports his annual tournament far better than your counterpart anywhere in Great Britain. Again we look forward to the 1973 championships being bigger still!

Of the hundreds and hundreds of games bowled at Cliftonville over the three week-ends one stood out above the rest - a game of 11 strikes in a row and a 9 count for a great 299. The author? Yes it was PHIL RUSSELL again, now the most prolific high game specialist anywhere in Europe. He has a sanctioned 298, two 299's and a 300 to his credit and with all the awards he must be getting from B.T.B.A. he should shortly be able to open his own jewellers! Phil's big one, he left the 5 pin on a brooklyn ball with his twelfth delivery, came in the double and enabled him with partner BOBBY MANSFIELD to land the scratch doubles title. TERRY SMITH and DEREK DEAN of Southend took the handicap event with BRENDA GAIGER and ANNE SIMMONS winning the ladies scratch doubles and two teams coming joint top in the handicap section. GILLIAN GIBB and DOROTHY NICHOLSON from Baxleybeath hitting 1221 exactly the same to the pin as PAT GORDON and MYRA KELSEY for the Dagenham Gems. The first time a SEBA title has been shared.

As with every area championships it was not the top scratch bowler who won the majority of the titles and such names as PAULINE DENHAM, PAUL CRUNDELL and the HELMSMEN are not yet household names but they won area titles in 1972 - and really that is what it is all about. Although each event has a scratch section the main titles go on a handicap basis as this is the tournament for every SEBA member and is so designed to give everyone a chance, not only of the glory but of sharing the prize fund that this year totalled nearly £600.00.

A SECRETARY'S RESPONSIBILITY

Many applications are being received for completely new supplies of materials for leagues who are extending their schedule through the Summer but appear to be regarding themselves as brand new leagues.

All league secretaries please note that individual record cards are designed to cover a 52 week period. Only new cards should be required for new members and teams.

Should the composition of your league be different for the Summer schedule, that is the number of players per team changes or if there is a change in league officers do not re-apply for sanction. Simply advise Area Office of the extended date and of the alterations when coverage will be extended.

The only new materials that should be required are standing sheets as these are normally supplied in accordance with the ending date of the league as shown on the original sanction application form. Further supplies would not normally be issued unless an application for extension is received.

League Champions Badges and Achievement Award Badges are issued in August to the Winter leagues or new leagues. If a league extends into the Summer season and requires a further set of badges, or badges in excess of the playing strength of the teams, these may be purchased from B.T.B.A. at a cost price of 20p per badge. Applications in this respect should be sent, with the appropriate remittance, to B.T.B.A. HEAD OFFICE, 19, CANTERBURY AVENUE, ILFORD, ESSEX.
