A SECRETARY'S RESPONSIBILITY

Many applications are being received for completely new supplies of materials for leagues who are extending their schedule through the Summer but appear to be regarding themselves as brand new leagues.

All league secretaries please note that individual record cards are designed to cover a 52 week period. Only new cards should be

required for new members and teams.

Should the composition of your league be different for the Summer schedule, that is the number of players per team changes or if there is a change in league officers do not re-apply for sanction. Simply advise Area Office of the extended date and of the alterations when coverage will be extended.

The only new materials that should be required are standing sheets as these are normally supplied in accordance with the ending date of the league as shown on the original sanction application form. Further supplies would not normally be issued unless an application for extension is received.

Leagus Champions Badges and Achievement Award Badges are issued in August to the Winter leagues or new leagues. If a league extends into the Summer season and requires a further set of badges, or badges in excess of the playing strength of the teams, these may be purchased from B.T.B.A. at a cost price of 20p per badge. Applications in this respect should be sent, with the appropriate remittance, to B.T.B.A. HEAD OFFICE, 19, CANTERBURY AVENUE, ILFORD, ESSEX.


