This front page originally had complete details of the 1st. Annual Inter-Centre S.E.B.A. Championships that were to be held at Cliftonville on 26th. November. Unfortunately three centres within the Area were unable to compete on this date due to commitments in the new British League and, with apologies to the other four who were already organised, the event has now been postponed to a date in the early New Year to be announced. The centres to be competing for the title are Basildon, Dagenham, Southend and Walton in Essex and Bexleyheath, Cliftonville and Whitstable in Kent plus, if they can still raise a team, Harlow whose doors were closed after the date of the original tournament acceptance earlier this year. These same centres will soon have on sale fruit machine tickets printed ' Essex County Team and S.E.B.A.! and 'Kent County Team and S.E.B.A.' These new tickets will replace the old S.E.B.A. ones that have kept your Area financially solvent in the season just passed. Actually a number of members have queried how the Area has been managing since the new scheme whereby members pay only a nominal 10p membership and the proprietor donates 1p for each league or tournament series bowled. In the past membership was £1 of which 50p went to the Area. Now the member contributes nothing to his own Area except that which he donates by way of purchasing the fruit machine tickets - and many have, in fact, made a profit particularly if they have won a £5.25 jackpot! That an area association needs funds in order to operate is obvious but to many the amount required will come as a surprise. This years Annual General Meeting will detail the expenditure in this

respect and details of the date, time and venue appear on another page. This last year the Area have helped to finance both Essex and Kent teams in the B.T.B.A. Inter- County Championships but under the new system the counties will, in fact, support their Area. For every 22p that is paid for a fruit machine ticket 60% will go to county funds who will pay adminstration costs and purchase of further tickets and 40% will go into Area funds. Whatever your personal views upon these tickets they are our only means of major revenue and are essential to the continuance of S.E.B.A. Please buy one when it is offered and if you fancy yourself as a seller contact DOLLY HART for Essex or TOM BALLINGALL or JOHN SAWYER for Kent. League secretaries who can sell within

their own leagues should act in the same way.

In fact the £100.00 guaranteed first place hinged on the very last frame of the tournament with the holders coming out on top for the third year running by just 6 pins. RAY HOOK topped the Wembley All Stars score sheet with 582 just in front of GORDON HOLLIER on 578. For Bernie's team RALSTON REID totalled 597 with ANDY MCLAREN and Bernie himself on a 583 apiece. The SCEPTRES came into third spot headed by BRIAN MICHAEL with a fine 654, FOUNDATION were fourth with CHRIS SMITH with a 606 and MALLORY CLASSICS fifth with BRUCE PEARCE hitting the high settof the day on games of 235-209-232 for a fine 676.

Staging a tournament restricted to scratch fives is becoming increasingly more and more difficult as the years go by and as more of the leading players are grouped into the top 5 or 6 teams. For this reason a new format is to be considered for next year where the top 12 teams in the country will be invited to compete on a round robin basis. Each team to play one game against every other team with a final position round. Ten hours bowling will be involved and if the atmosphere is anything like the Paris International who already use this structure it will be quite a day in 1973.

Whilst the Inter-County Championships are a very fine event it is the opinion of this publication that the Inter Counties Committee should think carefully before launching the same qualifying format for the tournament in 1973. As matters are the geographical location of a number of counties is such as to place them on the doorstep of very strong counties and even if a county is quite good enough - and in some instances better - than a number of finalists they will never have the opportunity to compete in the grand final. In order to save in both time and money some form of zoning is necessary for the qualifiers but the grouping could be on a larger basis of say 6 or even 8 counties with two going through rather than the present top county only. Alternatively a semi-final could be held prior to the grand final where each finalist plus the top 10 highest average qualifiers are included. In this way a side such as London men with a 900 plus average would at least have had a second bite of the cherry and the likes of Wales who could only muster an average of 773 in the finals would not have an automatic ticket to Coventry. It has become apparent this year that some counties are 'giving up the ghost' before the zoned rounds are complete because they stand no chance and others are not entering at all. This state of affairs could well be the start of a falling off in popularity in the championships and the committee will ignore the signs at their peril.
