The event opens on April 5th 1973 and will be unlikely to culminate until the middle of August and this included squads commencing on some days at 1.30a.m. The previous record for the ladies congress in the U.S.A. was 6,094 teams set in New York in 1967.

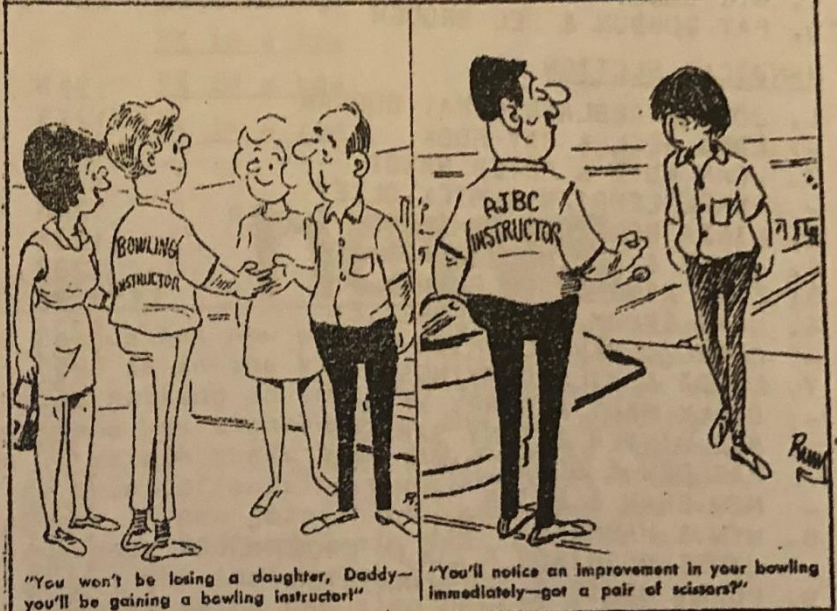

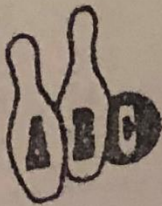
