Two scores from the 12.30p.m. squad, an 1191 scratch from JIM CARPENTER and JOHN PURVIS giving them 1323 with handicap added and an 1194 actual, 1310 handicap from TONY NUNN and JOHN WELLS held top positions until the 7.15p.m. squad when the Playboys duo of ROGER EVANS and TONY CROSBIE decided to re-enter.
