In accordance with the mandate given by the delegates at the 1973 Annual General Meeting of the B.T.B.A. and subsequently by the Council to the Executive Committee the recommendation of the B.T.B.A. lawyers has now been implemented and the B.T.B.A. is now the BRITISH TENPIN BOWLING ASSOCIATION LIMITED. This move is a part of the overall policy of the Executive to protect the future of the Association and the mammoth task of completely re-drefting the complete Constitution has been undertaken by the Legal Committee Chairman ERIC TERRY and the General Secretary MAURICE GLAZER who are to be congretulated on being in a position to present the finished task at this year's A.G.M. held on 27th. July 1974.

The new Memorandum and Articles of the B.T.B.A. Ltd were made available at the completion of the meeting and it is clear that the object. has been to align the Constitution more closely with the Association's current requirements and, at the same time, ensure that it is legally acceptable as the Articles of a company with a guaranteed limited liability. One of London's most prominent firms of solicitors, Messrs Jacques & Co., were engaged upon TED TINLING's recommendation to act for B.T.B.A. and over 100 hours of work has been put into the project by all those involved.

Among other things three major changes are in the revised

### Constitution:-

1. a new and strenghtened executive structure allowing direction by an Executive Committee of six together with twelve other members nominated and elected to the Council by the Area or County Associations, thus ensuring the continuity of a fully democratic national association.

2. a right of the elected Council to refuse membership of the Association with a new application proceedure designed to protect the Civil Rights 3. provision, for the first time, for a representative of the women B.T.B.A. members to sit on the Executive Committee.

# PSEBA

Up to two years ago half of the £1 dues to join B.T.B.A. went to the local Area Association. The necessary change in the financial structure of B.T.B.A. resulted in this, and the other local associations, not having an automatic income from their members and this has been the situation until

the present time. Any association must have funds in order to operate and we adopted a system of selling fruit machine tickets which just about kept our heads above water but most of the Area services and awards could not be carried on as we had not the finances necessary for their continuance. Something new had to be devised if we were again to introduce many of the services that our members wanted such as Area Hi Plaques, Special Award Badges, New Year Honour Scrolls etc etc and something new had to be devised if Bowling News and even the Association itself was to carry on as the tickets were causing problems between centres and even, to some extent, between the counties. A number of ideas were put forward for S.E.B.A's survival and the best was a scheme whereby our members paid just 1p to the Association every time they bowled in a sanctioned league or tournament within the Area. The scheme was put forward to all league delegates at the Annual General Meeting, all the delegates returned to obtain a mandate from their leagues and at our very first Extraordinary Meeting the proposal was

carried by 200 votes to 11. So far so good and already the Essex and Kent County Teams have benefited and some of the old services plus some new ones are under way. Most leagues are paying their 1p but some are having trouble in making the payment into Area funds. If your league does not have a system whereby the pennies are paid to the bowl representative or through the centre management you can still participate and obtain all that S.E.B.A. now has to offer.
