Held at the Humber Bowl, Southend and organised by the newly formed Southend Tournament Committee this first promotion was a great success. 280 teams entered and produced an excellent prize fund total of over £400.00 which was divided as shown below. Two centre records were totalling 1285 to win the scratch section of the men's event and included was a fine 738 from GEOFF BUCK including a 278 game. 24 sets of over 600 were also recorded with 145 games over 200. To start the New Year Area Hi's this one will take some beating! Just one 3000 five man series was hit last season. Already this year we have two! Also from the New Standard Fives league the TRANSWORLD team set the standard for the season's high game for 4-person team with a fine 857 game - the team carrying a blind score for the night. MICK OLLEY led with 241 followed by BILLY ORR 234, TERRY CORNEY 197 and COLIN HAYWARD 185.

In the Bexleyheath Spartan Doubles MALCOLM YOUNGMAN recently surpassed himself with a 246 game and a 570 series. His previous high set was a 440 and he had never before hit a 200 game. Malcolm carries a 129 average.

SEBA Executive Officer STEVE WHITE bowling in the Bexleyheath Olympic League bowled 7 strikes in one game and made the glorious total of 158! Not quite as good as the 'record' held by BILLY PRESTON in the Dagenham Supreme who opened all the odd numbered frames and struck in all the evens giving him a 7 strike total of 148!

A 7-10 split conversion has been recorded at Bexleyheath by PETER RIGHT who didn't even see it happen! Leaving a 4-7-10 split BTBA Council Member TED SHRIMPSON decided to go just for the safe 10 pin - being left handed. He completely misfired and his ball sailed down the left of the lane instead of the right. He converted the split!

High series in the Supreme League at Dagenham at the moment is held by JANET MORRISON on a 658.

In the Dagenham Masters two good scores arrived just too late to appear in the Area Hi's but in time to record here. The TREETOP team have made a very nice 667 game and 1845 three man series which are the new standards to beat for the season.

With regret we have to report the death of POP PHILPOTT who passed away in St Bart's Hospital, Rochester in October after a stroke. Pop was one of the original league bowlers at Chatham and bowled in both the Memphis and Industrial Leagues right up to when the centre was closed down. He was a leading advocate in the fight to keep the centre open and was for many years the Chairman of the House Committee there putting in many hours work on behalf of the sport. On closure Pop went with the Memphis League to Whitstable and there joined forces with the Harbour League where he was elected President. He undertook the organisation of a number of away trips for the league and was a person who was always prepared to put himself out to create enjoyment for others and their families and always had a pleasant word for everyone. Pop Philpott will be greatly missed.

Booths Gin ESSEX SHIELD

The revised and singularly successful 'round robin' format for this event that began last year was continued for the 1974 ESSEX SHIELD and once again the atmosphere was tremendous with every one of the 144 games having a bearing on the eventual result. The ABBOTS

didn't look like title contenders when they just scraped home in their first game against the lads from the Channel Islands by 866 to 864 but they managed to stay ahead throughout despite losing to the ALL STARS twice. The ALL STARS themselves had a disastrous beginning but their strong finish was not quite enough as the table below testifies. First place paid out £100.00, 2nd. £50.00, 3rd. £25.00, 4th. £15.00 and 5th. £5.00. The team high game for the day was the All Star's 1041 closely followed by the Abbot's 1035. Individual high game went to BOBBY MANSFIELD with a 268 and the Abbots had the most wins with 10 out of 12. Points were awarded as 1 for a game win and 1 for every 500 pins bowled. After each team had played the other 11 sides there was a final position round. Presentations were done on the spot and the 'Essex Shield' was duly handed over to the Abbots by the champions from 1973, the Richmond Grill.

TAKE IT FROM THE PROS

Know your roll

The designations "full roller," "semi-roller" and "spinner" sound complicated, but they're not.

To determine the type of hook ball you roll vision your ball as a sphere and check the ball track on the ball (the ball track is the area where the ball rolls and is evident because the portion of the ball making contact with the lane picks up minute particles of dust and lane finish).

If this ball track goes around the full circumference of the ball it's a full roller. If it covers approximately three quarters of the circumference it is known as a semi roller, a three quarter roller and sometimes a semi spinner.

The spinner covers a very small portion of the circumference and in extreme cases is a tiny circle on the ball.

In ball release you use little wrist motion in delivering the full roller. The semi roller incorporates a slightly broken wrist at ball release while in the release of the spinner the wrist is well broken and utilizes an emphatic right to left movement.

These are the three basic rolls and there are variations of each according to the speed, the amount of lift and

turn applied, and the angle used.

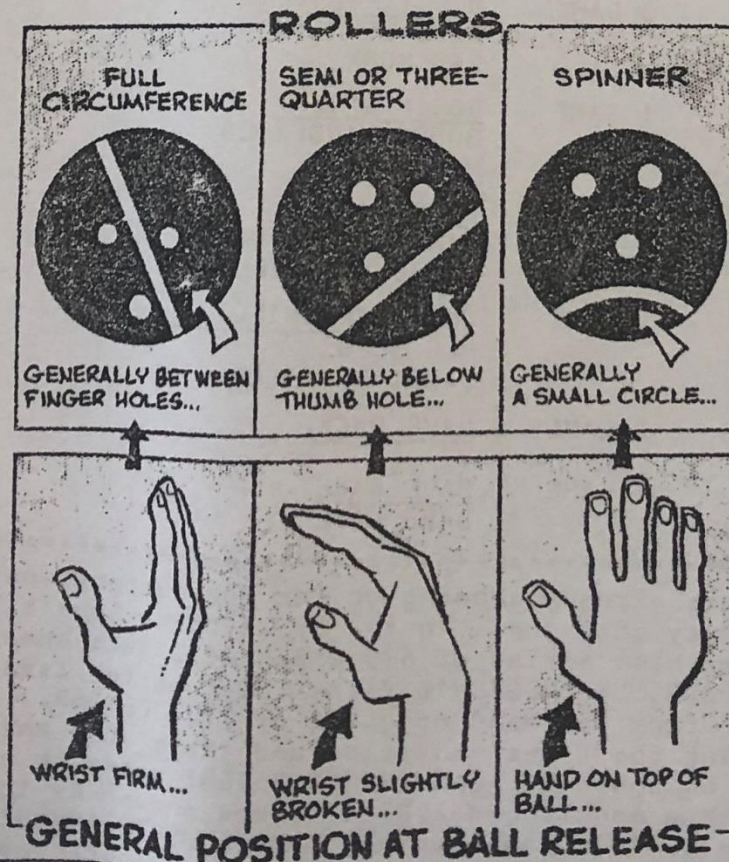
The semi roller is the most adaptable for all lane conditions and most pros prefer it as it combines the assets of the roller and the spinner.

The full roller results in plenty of action with probably the least amount of effort while the spinner, used by few bowlers, is at its best as a ball that sets well into the pocket.

Discussions often become heated when discussing the merits of the various rolls. Any bowler can roll well with any type of roll. The roll is normally the result of the natural way you bowl and can be difficult to change without plenty of practice and patience.

And, as veteran star and Hall of Famer Tony Sparando, past 65 and still averaging 200, always has pointed out, "The name of this game is to hit the pocket. Place that ball in the pocket consistently and you'll do all right, no matter what the roll."

Know what your ball does, and why it does it, and go from there.
