THE WONDER .. WHITSTABLE !

It took 14 years for the S.E.B.A. Area Championships to arrive at Whitstable, mainly due to fears as regards the size of the centre to hold, what have become the largest Area Championships held anywhere in Great Britain. To say that the fears were completely unjustified is to put it mildly as the 14th Championships were the biggest ever in history and, without doubt, the most successful that have ever been run. The total prize fund was a fine sum of over £750 and, with just 10 lanes on which to run the 16 events, the Championships were held over three weekends. Each day commenced at 9a.m. and did not finish until nearly midnight. The machines were virtually trouble free and the lanes, although not easy, were fair to everyone and the cleanliness was a tribute to those responsible. Manager STEVE FIELD and his Assistant KERRY PURCELL couldn't possibly have been more helpful and the same comments go to all the centre staff from the mechanics and lanesmen to the snackbar and bar staff.

The task of scheduling a record breaking tournament on 10 lanes was the headache of Area Secretary BRIAN LANGFORD, who managed to such an extent that complaints as regards dates and times were kept to the absolute minimum. The particular co-operation of the Whitstable bowlers themselves in accepting all the unpopular times without any fuss was very helpful indeed and our thanks go to them for their unselfishness.

Most of the S.E.B.A. Council Members were fully engaged in

assisting throughout from President TED SHRIMPTON on Registration to local man VIC GREEN on marshalling and all the others in between. BRIAN NEWSON received a great number of deserved congratulations for his fine scoreboard and a word here would not be out of place as regards others, not on the local Council, who worked like beavers such as JOHN and SUE AMOS, ALAN CHAPMAN, BOB PARKER and DAVE COHEN.

In the midst of all the activity the annual Masters
Championships were slotted in somehow and new names appeared on both
trophies. Congratulations to DAVE BUCK of Whitstable and LINDA CUMMINGS
of Dagenham and Southend. Their scores appear on an inside page.

The Championships themselves were a triumph for local bowler PAULINE DENHAM who won no less than three titles and the LONDON ALL STARS did very well for themselves coming in on the final weekend and taking the first three places in the scratch all events, the top two places in the scratch singles and winning the scratch team event with the only 2800 bowled. Others who took an Area title for the first time were young WAYNE HARRISON of Cliftonville, MARC CARVER from Dagenham, CHRISTINE BROWN and MARILYN BUCKLEY of Dagenham, JOAN NUTT and SUE MORDEN of Southend and Basildon and STEVE CARNALL and KEVIN RAISON, Bexleyheath.

May you make the 15th Championships in 1977, probably to be

held at Dagenham, even bigger.

OUR MASTERS

20 men and 10 ladies competed for the S.E.B.A. Invitational Masters for 1976 played during the Area Championships at Whitstable and all played a 5 game series. A new name has gone onto the men's trophy every year to date and this time was no exception with the new champion being DAVE BUCK from the home bowl with a five game average of over 200 The ladies event has been dominated until now by Morrisons,

with VI MORRISON taking the crown once and JANET MORRISON heading the field for each of the last three years. 1976 was to be a different story, however, with Janet not her best and the new title holder is young LINDA CUMMINGS who bowls at both Dagenham and Southend.
