# JAN HODGE & CHRIS SMITH are the 1998 KENT MASTERS

The format for the 1998 Masters was slightly different this year. Each of the twelve qualifiers bowled four games over four different lanes and then the top six bowlers bowled a further two games to reduce the field to four who then bowled a one game semi-final to sort out the finalists for a one game final.

Starting with a 234 Game, Jan Hodge swept into the lead which she maintained through all the qualifying session to score 1210 over six games averaging 201.6.

The fight for the other positions was extremely close and after four games Doreen Lodge was lying second on 677, some 130 pins behind Jan, Lucy

Cudmore third on 676, Angie Thick in fourth with 670 and Sheila White and Mandi Shrimpton joint fifth on 652. Those missing out at this stage were Elaine Hinch [651] and Carole Lakin [649].

Eliminated at the six game stage were Doreen Lodge and Mandi Shrimpton.

In the semi-finals Jan Hodge drew with Lucy Cudmore 189-189 which meant a 9-10 Frame Play Off was required which Jan won 59-39 and Sheila White beat Angie Thick 191-147. The Final was between two team mates but, as usual, very competitive with Jan Hodge beating Sheila White 212-189 to become a worthy Kent Master after excellent consistent bowling throughout with an overall average of 201.3.

Throughout the qualifying six games, Keith Hodge held first place after Game 2 scoring 1331 to average 221.8, but this was only a marginal lead as after four games, Chris Smith was in second place on 859 just 17 pins behind Keith. Steve White was lying third on 792 with Malcolm Fuller and Clive Mitchell joint fourth on 749. There was also a tie for sixth place between Mike Luckhurst and Rob Packman on 743 needing a 9-10 frame play-off for Mike Luckhurst to proceed to the next stage.

Just missing out after four games only three pins behind on 740 were Bill Shrimpton and Chris Skudder.

In the Semi-Finals Keith Hodge beat Malcolm Fuller 193-189 and Chris Smith beat Steve White 221-189.

The Final between Chris Smith and Keith Hodge ended in a comfortable win for Chris Smith by 199 to 173 to crown Chris as the 1998 Kent Master.

## AMF EXPAND INTO KENT

AMF have recently announced that it has completed the acquisition of 11 Bowling Centres in the United Kingdom comprising 241 lanes. Seven Centres have been purchased from Bass Leisure and in a separate transaction four more bought from Kent based Pentagon centres. Among the Centres bought from Bass Leisure is Hollywood Bowl in Margate.

AMF now operate Six Centres in Kent, namely:-

ASHFORD [18 lanes] CHATHAM [16 lanes] GRAVESEND [24 lanes] MAIDSTONE [18 lanes] MARGATE [24 lanes] WHITSTABLE [10 lanes] AMF have always been committed to the promotion of properly constituted leagues and tournaments in addition to open bowling.

As an Association we look forward to working with AMF in the expansion of league and tournament bowling in the County in the furtherance of our sport.

The opening round of the Regular Inter-Counties was held in Kent at Bexleyheath. There were seven Counties for both the Men and the Ladies - all being five person teams - and following the second round, to be held at Raynes Park in September, two teams from each Group will advance to the Finals.

## KEITH HODGE BREAKS FOUR RECORDS at the K.T.B.A. AREA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1998 Kent County Area Championships were held over three weekends in May at Bugsy's Bowl in Cliftonville. For many, it was the first opportunity to study the Bowl since its major facelift and to enjoy the monitors detailing the speed of delivery and unusual graphics.

In the listings of the results, those winning prize money are shown in bold type.

The highlight of the Tournament was the bowling of Keith Hodge by breaking all previous records in the Regular Singles and All Events when averaging 239.4 over his nine games. His individual games were 279,259 & 227 in the Singles, 246,224 & 244 in the Doubles and 237,216 & 223 in the Team - an awesome performance and a delight to watch.

#### REGULAR SINGLES

The leader after the first day was David Conner, a new bowler from Bexleyheath who bowled his first ever consecutive 200 games to give him a total with handicap of 701. This was eclipsed by Jeffrey White on the middle weekend, Jeffrey having come through the Junior ranks at Bexleyheath and maturing rapidly as an adult bowler to challenge his Mother and Father. Sheila and Steve White. Then came Keith Hodge to shatter the records but on the last day even he was being challenged by Jack Denne, a regular league bowler from the Fireball League at Bexleyheath of many year's standing who put together one of his best ever series to eventually finish in second place.

Despite all this high scoring, there were only seven bowlers who beat the 600 series mark in the Scratch Singles with some local bowlers filling many of the positions although second place went to Keith Allsop, a member of Keith Hodge's team from Bexleyheath.

The only two 600 series not entered in the Scratch Section were by David Conner and Jeffrey White who, not surprisingly, would not have anticipated finishing in the high ratings of the Scratch Section.

Top of the tree overall and assured of at least one game in the Junior Counties in September were Helen Perkins of Whitstable, who rolled two solid, consistent series of 568 and 564, with James Pateman of Bexleyheath topping the boys table with 560 and 594 including three double-tons.

Whitstable girls generally had an excellent tournament, ten-year-old Claire Ward winning her division comfortably with a personal best 165 game in a 368 series; Veronica Wood topping Division 2 with a 141 average and, of course, Helen Perkins taking Division 3, her 568 series being the girls' best of the tournament. She was one of four Whitstable girls in Division 3's top five. Top girls game score was 212 from Whitstable's Jennifer Beale.

The boys spread things about a bit, with Chatham putting in the best overall showing. # BEXLEYHEATH & WHITSTABLE YBC'S STRIKE GOLD AT JUNIOR NATIONALS

# KEVIN FRANKS & BEN FROST from WHITSTABLE YBC win GOLD at NOTTINGHAM

WHAT a terrific week for the Whitstable YBC junior tenpin bowlers! We have some national doubles champions and, for the second year running, a qualifier for the England junior team to play the home international competition, the Triple Crown, at Carlisle later in the Summer!

A squad of 22 went to the NAYBC Junior National Championships in Nottingham over the Bank Holiday weekend and returned with successes galore. This tournament runs through the whole month of May. Some 2300 youngsters enter from 101 YBCs all around the country - an entry that makes the event the biggest junior tenpin tournament in the world. No other country - not even the USA or Japan - can boast a junior tournament anywhere near this size.

Consequently, winning, or even coming close to winning, anything in these Championships is something very special indeed! 12-year-olds Kevin Franks and Ben Frost, both from Whitstable, won gold in the Junior Boys Doubles with a superb performance. Kevin bowled steadily rolling 176, 160, 177 for an excellent 513 series whilst Ben had some trouble in the first game but stormed back with two super double-centuries, 112, 202, 207 for 521, giving the duo an excellent total of 1034 in conditions that certainly were not ideal. Kevin also picked up a bronze medal in the Junior Boys All-Events. His 1530 gave him a 170 average over the nine games - no mean feat for any bowler! Whilst this was Ben's first-ever Nationals medal, Kevin has now won at least one medal every year for the past four years - a record that will take some beating!

In the Senior Boys division, Andrew Wraight, 15, bowled a 182.8 average over his nine games. Whilst this was not enough for a medal, it was enough to put him into the top six under-16 boys in the country, and gain him that magical Junior England status for the Triple Crown tournament in Carlisle in August. Andrew follows Jennifer Beale, who qualified for the equivalent competition last year, becoming the first Whitstable male junior to make this grade in the YBC's ten-year history!

Jennifer, meantime, learned that she will be the sole Whitstable junior in the Kent County *adult* team due to play the first round of the Inter-County Championship at Bexleyheath.

Even the youngest local juniors (ten years and under) did superbly in the Nationals but couldn't quite make the podium. The five-person team missed the bronze medal by just one pin, finishing fourth. Nine-year-old Nico Joiner was the unluckiest of the team, having held a medal position in all four disciplines in his age-group singles, doubles, team and all-events yet coming home empty-handed. Emily Frost (Ben's younger sister just ten years old) also at one time shared the bronze medal position in the singles whilst Kirsty Belchem, just eight the week before the tournament and the YBC's youngest member, shared a potential silver doubles medal with Nico, only to be edged out of the medals in the final squad. Michael Thompson, 10, the eldest of the team, rolled two series of 457 and 452 in the singles and doubles, both beating his previous personal best, whilst ten yearold James Oliver, bowling in his very first Nationals, beat his previous best series in the team game with 293.

# ANNALISE EDWARDS & ALEX REED from BEXLEYHEATH YBC win GOLD at NOTTINGHAM

The Gold Medal in the Junior Girls Doubles event at the NAYBC Junior Nationals was won by Annalise Edwards and Alex Reed with a score of 1062 [Annalise 546, Alex 516].

Bexleyheath YBC bowled on the first weekend of the Championships and had to wait four weeks to find out if they had won any medals. When they left the Bowl, several Bexleyheath bowlers were on the leader board, but as often happens most were overtaken leaving the girls as the only winners.

As mentioned in the Whitstable report, the winning of any medal at these Championships is a tremendous performance and deserves every praise.

The tournament has the usual format of Singles, Doubles, Five-Person Team and All-Events [9 games].

To show the strength of the competition, the following scores won no medals.
