## Junior Inter-Counties.

The usual pilgrimage to Coventry Megabowl for the county's best junior bowlers was made on September 12th, under the watchful eye of deputy manager Eric Harvey and county motivators David Percival [boys] and Paul Pateman [girls].

Confidence and expectations were higher than usual after the boys succeeded in picking up the bronze medal during last year's Inter-Counties, but the weekend hardly got off to a flier when one of the top ranked junior boys, Andrew Wraight of Whitstable, had to pull out.

Poor Andrew! He had worked brilliantly through last season, making the Junior England team for the Triple Crown home internationals at Carlisle (hence becoming Whitstable's first male junior international and qualifying 20th in the overall rankings for a shot at the European Cup England team for next Easter. Sadly, just before the Triple Crown, he broke his left arm and had to withdraw both from the Triple Crown and the Inter-Counties. He has our every sympathy.

As the inter-county games got under way, it was apparent that we were not going to be in for any big scoring - not from Kent or from anybody, for that matter. Whereas last year, the Kent boys rolled three 1000+ five-man games, the most they could muster this time out was 844. The girls managed just one game over 800 but were still in there on Sunday challenging for a top six round robin place.

Bexleyheath provided the top performers of the competition - Martin Pateman averaged 176 for the boys whilst Annalise Edwards turned in 169 for the girls. Both managed a high game of 202. Whitstable's Helen Perkins and Jennifer Beale also delivered sound performances for the girls, averaging 162 and 156 respectively whilst the top game score overall was 212 from Margate's Ben Marsh. The only other 200 - on the nail - came from Bexleyheath's Nick Weston.

Out of 32 teams, the boys disappointingly ended up somewhere around 16th. The girls, however, managed a creditable ninth.

## LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Jerry,

We write in response to Mr Leeds' letter in the June *Bowling News* in which he is somewhat critical of the team-building techniques employed by the junior teams at the Area Championships at Cliftonville. He is, of course, entitled to his opinion, but it must be pointed out that it is fortunately not one that is shared by the bowling fraternity at large, unless - as he in fact points out - they do not happen to be bowling well themselves at the time.

The two teams in question were not only preparing to defend titles at the biggest junior tournament in the world, the NAYBC National Championships at Nottingham, the following week, but were also each playing for a place in those teams. They knew that they needed not only to bowl well, but also to be good, supportive team members.

It is quite understood by these youngsters that gamesmanship and ungentlemanly conduct are unacceptable at any tournament, no matter how big or important it is. We would suggest that at no time did any junior direct any comments or criticisms at their opponents directly or indirectly, nor did they intend to behave in any way that could be construed as interfering with the bowling of anyone else - unless others have a problem with noise. In fact the captain of one of the teams, when it was indicated that a complaint about noise had been received by the tournament organisers, was most concerned, and made a point of repeatedly asking if their team-building was in breach of any regulation or could be considered unacceptable. The answer to this, according to every rule in the book, had to be no.

Team-building is a vital part of any successful bowling team's approach. To this end, extensive congratulation of bowlers by their team-mates for their ongoing achievements is required and encouraged at all times, provided the effort isn't such that it exhausts the bowler before they have completed their games. Juniors are not *instructed* to chant or make a lot of noise, but, at many tournaments, organisers actively encourage noisy chanting and cheering with a view to enhancing the competitive atmosphere. The things we all abhor at any tournament, junior or adult, are bad temper, bad language and deliberate

gamesmanship - something our juniors surely cannot be accused of. Concentration is essential, but good bowlers must be able to concentrate whatever is going on around them. After all, decibel levels from gaming machines, tannoys, music and the bowling machinery itself are hardly insignificant.

Perhaps we might finish by quoting Rule 19 from this year's London International, as distributed with the July edition of *Go Tenpin Magazine*. "Entrants should be aware that cheering and applause will be encouraged at all stages of the Tournament. Bowlers must not wait for silence before bowling." Team bowling competitions would be much less exciting if they did.

Dear Jerry,

On behalf of the Kent Junior Sub-Committee I would like to reply to the comments made by Dave Leeds in his letter published in the June edition of *Bowling News*.

Firstly these "youth bowlers" - as he calls them - are neither instructed to nor discouraged from making a noise while bowling in a team event, the chanting is not intended to distract other bowlers or teams but is used to help themselves gel as a unit, it also keeps them focused on their own team game and acts as a barrier against intimidation from others around them. This includes the bullying tactics of swearing and cursing used by some bowlers who blame anything and everything other than their own abilities when not bowling well.

Regarding the comment over bowling etiquette. Being a sanctioned tournament I did enquire and had confirmed by officials on the day, that it is quite legal to make a noise as long as no mechanical devices are used and the noise is not directed at anybody outside the team. Consequently neither team broke any BTBA or tournament codes of conduct.

As for respect. This works both ways. Did anybody respect the pressure those players were under? Did anybody know

or care that they were seven days away from defending their gold and bronze medal positions in probably the largest and noisiest tournament in the WORLD and each bowler was fighting for a place in the team. No! they didn't. These teams are entered into the Area Championships as part of a team building exercise and to show their coaches how they could handle pressure situations. I thought they did remarkably well considering they faced; whinging, moaning official complaints, abuse and criticism.

The one thing both Dave and I agree on, is the sentence "bowling is like any other sport which is more enjoyable when successful and at times requires a certain amount of concentration". Perhaps the secret of their success on the day was the fact that both teams or individuals had concentrated half as much on what they were doing instead of worrying about what others were doing, they too could have been more successful and in turn may have enjoyed themselves as well. Lastly, I was going to finish as Dave with a proverb, the one that says - "if you can't stand the heat - get out of the kitchen", but that would infer that we are too arrogant and don't care! and that's not true. All these bowlers want is to be successful and be accepted as part of the present as well as the future of Kent bowling. So next time fellow bowlers - BEFORE BOWLING BADLY - maybe you could come and have a civilised chat with the team manager. We may be able to compromise to everybody's satisfaction.
